My dear Miss Thomason:

Am sorry to say I can give you no further proof that your Richard Thomason (Will in Will Book H - p. 288, 1824 Rowan County, N. C.) is the son of George and Mary Pollard of Louisa Co., Va. I believe though that he is - and that the George Thomason who made will in Rowan N. C. in Will Book C, p. 49, 1792, was his brother. I also believe that he came into N. C. with my William Thomason - and is the Richard Thomason who was in Henry Co., Va. tax list in 1782.

So many people want the Thomason line - but some that look it up get it very tangled. There were so many of the same name - especially Williams and Johns - not so many Richards. My great grandfather William's son, Richard, never married - so that eliminates one of them.

Don't waste much time on Thomsons - it is a distinctly different line - occasionally it is written for Thomason, but I have "run it down" so many times to find it meant Thomson - unless Thomason followed at least two times in the text.

Mrs. Armstrong wrote me June 27, 1932:

* * * There were Thomasons in Louisa County, Va. as early as 1700. There was a William, George, and Samuel Thomason. All of them had sons named William, Richard, George, some Thos., Bias or Byers. * * * Our William's Rev. war recors show he was born in Louisa Co., Va., then lived in Orange and Henry Cos., Va., and died in Washington Co., Ga. The Thomasons ran so to the same names that it is hard to find to which branch one belongs.

These are: one of 17 1/2 acres on the east side of Swearing creek next the original tract of Michael Myer's which went to Lucy out of the deceased Michael Myer's estate; one of 10 acres laid out for the widow, Mary Myers; & one of 10 acres which was in the dover land of Mary Myers, the widow, but laid out for Elizabeth Thomas--all being part of the original tract from Henry McCulloh to Michael Myres.

Clinard & Britain J. Heymore & proved in Aug. 1805.

Book 5 page 75: Aug. 10 1762, Earl Granville lets Gideon Wright of Rowan Co.N.C., have 69 acres vacant land on east side Yadkin River opposite Benjamin Pettitt at the mouth of a branch, for 10 shillings, witnessed by John Frohock & proved in 1762.

The will of Richard Thomason (Book H page 288) made while "verry weak an low in body" on Sept. 4 1824 & probated in Nov. term of 1824. Son-in-law William Julian (whose wife is Fanny). Sons: George, Bias & William. Grandchildren: Hannah, Thomas, James & Ann Kincaid. Exrs: son George & friend Benjamin Howard. Witnesses: A.T. Horn & John Howard.

Mrs. Robert W. Price, says that William Julian was father of David, Lut. & Jess. He was very dissipated and often would run his wife and children out of the house for the night when drunk. David went to live with the Chunn family-- possibly for this reason, and thereby was made into a man. The Julians lived east of town, she thought.

Mr. William Murphy was a widower with at least two children when he married Susan C. Chunn. One child married Samuel Harrison and had at least three children: Robert, Samuel and a girl Sally? The boy may have died of tuberculosis as did some of his children by second wife. He kept a general mdse store at his home where the Graded School stands on east Innis St. Wealthy, they lived well and a crippled daughter had a negro to follow and carry her doll for her. His widow moved on corner of next block.

Winders & Massey Thomas & proved by the latter in Feb. 1815.
