Page 918 of the Sons of the American Revolution: Charles Sullivan as #13761, & Edwin R. Sullivan, as #13588 - both of Pittsburg, Pa., joined the Pennsylvania Society on the service of Ebenezer Jane, Commandant of Fort Pittcastle & Fort Henry.

May 8 1771: Henry Zively gets a licence to keep a tavern in his home in the town of Salisbury. His securities are Gasper Kinder & Henry Fulwedor.

Oct. 14 1763: John Mitchell vs Henry Ziviley. Orig. Atmt. 2.7.9 & 6d cost.

Book 25 page 738: On Feb. 15 1813, Daniel Bierly (a German?) lets James Zively have one acre on Swearing Creek & the public way from Lexington to Salisbury, next Jesse Hargrave & David Miller, for \$10.00, witnessed by Jesse Hargrave & Michael Holshouser & proved by Jesse Hargrave in Feb. term of 1820. (No wife signs).

Book 25 page 871, John H. Zively of Bedford Co. Tenn. makes James Zively of Howard Co. Missouri, Territory, his attorney to get what should come to him as heir of the deceased Henry Zively of Rowan Co. N.C., on Feb. 10 1820, certified by James McKisick, Clerk of Court in Bedford Co. Tenn. on Jan. 11 1820 no wife signs attorney. This 200 acres is in Rowan Co. N.C. and is where "the aforesaid Henry Zively dwelt at the time of his death", being 5 miles from the Yadkin River on the road leading from Salisbury to Salem.

May 1820 court held at Lexington, N.C.: Power of attorney from John H. Zively to James Zivily Jan. 10 1820 is acknowledged.

Book 11 page 189: Aug. 9 1787, The State grants (#1605 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to John Sloan 200 acres on Swan Creek & Potts Creek next Henry Stagner.

Book 21 page 817: Aug. 29 1809, Jacob Fisher, Jane Fisher, Jesse Hadon & Rosanna Hadon (heirs of deceased John Sloan of Rowan Co. N.C.), let Van N. Zively, John H. Zively, Alexander Zively & James Zively (heirs of deceased Henry Zively of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 200 acres on Swan Creek & Potts Creek on north side of Swans Creek next Henry Stagnor, for \$80.00, witnessed by Henry ? David Miller, M. Stokes & --- Devereay & acknowledged in Aug. 1810.

Book 6 page 591: On July 23 1768, Thomas Foster (no wife signs) lets the children of Henry Zively, (a "Taylor",), who are children under 7 years of age & named John & Margaret Zively, out of love & affection for them, the place where Henry Zively now lives, a cow, feather bed & furnishings, 2 rugs, a table, side saddle, chest, pewter dishes, &c., witnessed by Wm. Nassery & Wm. Martin in July term of 1768.

Book 9 page 287: Henry Zevery of Rowan Co. N.C., seems to be mortgaging for 67 pounds which are to be paid by next Christmas, to Frederick Goss, a bay horse mare branded M.C. on shoulder & buttock, 3 iron "potts", 3 pewter dishes, & many other things, witnessed by Joseph Towsay & James Brookshire in Aug. 1783.

The will of John Enochs (Book A page 24) made June 10 1765, mentions Henry Zively in his will. (over)

Henry Zively is dead & on May 3 1796: "Notice the widow of Henry Zively to appear at next Court and Administer on her husband's Estate or relinquish."

Nov. 11 1796: An inventory of the estate of Henry Zively is filed and amounts to 15.18.3.

Aug. 1796: Administration on the estate of Henry Zively is granted to Elenor Zively, widow whose son is the only child of Henry Zively. Mrs. Elenor Zively is the widow of the intestate who qualified and gave 100

# 3940 in D.A.R. Mag. of May 1915 wants information of Henry Zevery (er. Zeberly) who was born in Switzerland on Dec. 26 1736, emigrated to America about 1757 lived in S.C. at Ninety Six, but moved to Salisbury N.C. after the Revolution & kept a ferry. He is said to have been a Rev. patriot & proof of service is desired.

The above Henry Zively was in Rowan Co. & died about 1797. The marriage bond: Margaret Zively to Michael Beard dated Jan. 9 1787 is signed by J.L. Beard.

Betsy Lively to David Fraley Jan. 19 1811 signed by George Fraley. Catherin Lively(?) to John Furr Aug. 4 1784. Daniel Little (John McNairy). Susanna Zively(?) " David Miller May 1 1790. Peter Faust. Henry Lively(?) to Elenor Enochs April 3 1762. John Johnston, Wm. Williams, John Brandon & (Will Reed) while a note of consent written by bride's father John Enochs on March 29 1762.

The will of John Enochs (book A page 24) "Farmer being very sick & weak" on June 10 1764 probated in July 1765. Wife Margerate. Sons: David, Gabriel, & Isaac. Others: James Bryan (8 shillings), Henry Zively (8 shillings) & John (son of Samuel Bryan--8 shillings). Exrs: wife & Samuel Bryan. Witnesses: Samuel Jones, John Jones & Enoch Enochs.

Book 15 page 7: According to the will of John Lewis Beard deceased, his Exrs. (George Henry Berger, John Rantleman & Lewis Beard) let David Miller have 353 acres on Crain Creek next that of John Carson, --- Mourer & Reuben Phillips for 54 pounds & 3/4. Witnessed by Peter Faust & Jon Beard in May term 1797. (It was granted John Lewis Beard by the State.)

May 9 1793: Martin Seville Orphan of George Seville decd. being 15 years of age, is bound apprentice to Henry Furrer till he attain the age of 21 years, to learn the art & trade of a blacksmith, which the Master Covenants to learn him & to comply with the Law."

Miss Adelaide Fries page 280 of her book "Rowan County North Carolina, Vol. I says in 1764: "July 25. Yesterday a Swiss by the name of Civili came from Bryand's Settlement with his wife and little daughter. He asked earnestly for the baptism of the child, and as they are known to be worthy people this was granted, the service taking place in our Saal in the presence of a small company of the Brethren. The child received the name of Margaret." In 1765, page 303: "June 15. Br. Graff baptised the two-months-old son of Henry Civili, a Swiss from Bryands Settlement. He was named John."

Book 7 page 238: On Aug. 18 1770, Esq. William Temple Coles, as "high Sheriff" of Rowan County, N.C., lets Christopher Beekman, a merchant of the town, (on a Fieri Facias against Esq. William Harrison, attorney-at-law, got by Matthew Troy, gentleman & merchant, for 12 pounds & cost &c) have 36 sq. poles or 1/4 of lot #5 in the north square of the town, 3 poles fronting on Corbin St. & 12 poles back next the part where Henry Levely now lives (belonging to Esq. Edmond Fanning) & the part belonging to Esq. Alexander Martin, witnessed by Benjamin Milner & Will Steel & proved in Aug. 1770.

Book 4 page 745: July 22 1762, Henry Levely or Livilly--no wife signs--lets Jacob Arrand (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 629 acres next ---Little & Conrod Michel, for 5 shillings--the release price being 100 pounds on the next day--witnessed by Will Reed & Daniel Little & proved in July 1762. (Earl Granville let said Henry Levely? have this on April 4 1761).

Book 4 page 553: April 4 1761, Earl Granville lets Henry Zivilly, a "Taylor" of Rowan Co. N.C., have 629 acres of vacant land on waters of Grain Creek & Grants Creek next --- Little & Conrod Michael, for 10 shillings, witnessed by W. Lucas & John Frohock & proved by the latter in Oct. 1761.

Book 10 page 100: Feb. 5 1785, Christian Barbrick & wife Elizabeth, let John Buis--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 359 acres next Conrad Carn & said Barbrick, for 250 pounds, witnessed by Val Beard & Henry Giles Jr. & proved by the latter in Feb. 1785. (This is part of the 629 acres originally granted to Henry Zivilly who let Jacob Aaron have it, who let John Mitchell have it & he let Christian Barbrick have it).

Book 15 page 15: Feb. 9 1791, John Buis & wife Martha let Henry Giles have 359 acres next Conrod Cairns, Christian Barbrick, Michael Murr & said Buis, for 500 pounds

Book 15 page 73: Feb. 10 1797, Henry Giles & wife Elizabeth let Esq. Maxwell Chambers have the above 359 acres for 500 pounds

Book 19 page 603: Feb. 4 1806, Richard Trotter owning rights, Thomas McCaughy, L. Jacobs, John Marrand, Matthias Moor, Christian Fine & wife Mary, Dorathea Morris & Christianna Moor--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--let Maxwell Chambers also of Rowan, have for \$355.00

which is part of the 629 acres originally granted to Henry Zivilly who conveyed it to Jacob Arrand who let John Mitchell have, witnessed & proven by J.A. Fisher in Feb. 1806.

Book 15 page 15: On Feb. 9 1791, John Buis & wife Martha, let Henry Giles have 359 acres of land next Conrod Cairns, Christian Barbrick, Michael Murr & sd Buis for 500 pounds witnessed by Charles Munt & John Giles in May

Feb. 1814: William Creswell is appointed overseer of the Old Salem Road from Crumps Mill to Smith's road thence along Long's road near Zivily's old place. William Broadway is to assist him.

Book 15 page 73: On Feb. 10 1797, Henry Giles & wife Elizabeth, let Esq. Maxwell Chambers have 359 acres of land next Conrod Cairns & Michael Morris for 500 pounds witnessed by J.L. Beard & Jo. Chambers. (This is part of a 629 acre tract to Henry Zivelly who let Jacob Aaron have & he let John Mitchell have, & he let Christian Barbrick have, & he let John Buis have & he let Henry Giles have).

Feb. 1814: William Creswell (aided by William Broadway) is overseer of the Old Salem Road from Crumps Mill to Smith's road thence along Long's road near Zivily's old place.

Feb. 4 1789: James Thomson vs Henry Zively # 54. 9-1-4 & 6d cost. Deed of sale from Earl Granville to Henry Zively? for 629 acres April 4 1761 proved by John Frohock. Book 4 page Lease & release from Henry Zively? to Jacob Arrant for 629 acres July 23-24 1762 proved by Daniel Little. Book 11

Oct. 23 1761: Conrod Michael vs John N. Oglethorpe. Petit jury: Benjn Rounseval (foreman), Mathew Long, Thomas Boyles, Vincen Williams, Wm. Williams, Henry Zivily, Jno. Hagler, Penjn. Robison, Henry Williams, Malcolm Hamilton, Matt Gillispie & Jno. Turner. 16.0.0 & 6d cost. Henry Zivily is on other juries.

Oct. 25 1760: Henry Zivily or Livilly? proves deed from John Lewis Beard & wife Christian to William Williams 4 lots of land--this is also proved by William Reed.

Henry Horah= Constable instead of John Bone for Salisbury District Jan. 1768. Feb. 16 1770: Henry Zivily is appointed Constable instead of Henry Horah. (Henry Horah is appointed Constable in Capt. Michael's district of which John Dunn is a Justice in July 1765). Think that this would be in lower edge of Rowan for in Feb. 1772 "Henry Fulwider in the Roome of Michael Brown from Henry Horas Creek Along the Old Anson Road to the Anson Line" is made an overseer on the road. Henry Horah Sr. may have died 1772 after the Regulation and Henry Sr. probably moved closer in toward Salisbury, but was under age in 1772. Henry Horah is Constable in town of Salisbury in 1769.

July 23 1768: Gift of sundries from Thomas Foster to John & Margaret Zeviley for sundries dated July 23 1768 acknowledged.
