Book 18? page 512: On March 15 1798, James Stewart of Washington Co. Tenn. lets John Newnan M.D. of Rowan Co. N.C. have 450 acres on the branches of Cold Water Creek next John Campbell Sr. & John Graham, for 550 pounds, witnessed by Hugh Newnan & Thomas Stewart in May 1803. (This was got from Daniel Clary & the late Hugh Montgomery of Rowan Co. N.C., by James Stewart.)

N.C. --no wife signs--lets Peter Brown of Salisbury, N.C., have lot #9 in the great east square of Salisbury, fronting 75 1/2 feet, going southeast 11 poles & 4 feet & w*, for 575 pounds, witnessed by M. Troy & John Trexler & proved in Feb. 1811. (This was lately occupied by Jacob Sossamon & the executors of deceased Dr. Anthony Newnan let John Trexler have it, he let Jacob Sossamon have it & he let said Henery Sossamon have it).

Book 20 page 153?: Nov. 15 1809, John Trexler, a carpenter--no wife signs--lets Jacob Sassamon, a goldsmith & clockmaker (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have part of lot #9 in the great east square of Salisbury now occupied by William Pinkston, having 72 1/2 feet front, for \$1300.00, (which Dr. Newnan let said Trexler have),

Book 20 page 449: Feb. 17 1815, Daniel Newnan of Putnam Co. Ga. --no wife signs--lets Peter Helderbrand of Rowan Co. N.C., have lot #25 in the east square of Salisbury on Ennis St., for \$65.00, witnessed by Willie Yarrough & Humphrey Marshall & proved by the latter in May 1815.

May 1815: Deed from Daniel Newnan to Peter Helderbrand for lot #75 in east square of Salisbury, Feb. 17 1815 proved by Humphrey Marshall

Minutes of Saturday Aug. 22 1818: The settlement of Anthony Newman's estate is given by John Newman. The heirs are: Eli Gaither, Jesse Payne, Hugh, Daniel, Montgomery, Jane & Nancy Newman.

N.C.--have the upper half of 72 sq. poles of lot #2 (being 6 poles fronting on Corbin St. & 12 poles back) next lot #1, for 20 pounds, witnessed by James McMeachan & John Johnston & proved by the latter before M. Moore March 14 1772.

Book 19 page 872: On March 30 1806, Maxwell Chambers, Lewis Beard, John Newnan & Eli Gaither (as executors of the will of the deceased Anthony Newnan, of Rowan Co. N.C.) let Jeremiah Brown have lots #52 & 60 in the east square of Salisbury, for \$60.00, witnessed & proved by Thomas L. Cowan & proved in Feb. 1807.

Book 11 page 619: On Nov. 20 1788, Daniel Allamong--no wife signs--lets Tobias Forrar a blacksmith (both of Salisbury, N.C.) have lot #2 in the south square of the town (72 sq. poles) on the southernmost part (next the half which John Dunn & wife Mary let Dr. Anthony Newnan have) for 190 pounds, witnessed by Matt. Troy & Henry Giles & proved by the latter in Feb. 1789.

Book 31 page 737: On Oct. 4 1832, Mary E. Gaither of Bledsoe Co. Tenn., makes Richard Locke of Rowan Co. N.C., her attorney to sell 118 acres or her part of the estate of the deceased Eli Gaither which had descended to the heirs.

Book 32 page 264: Richard Locke, (as the attorney of Mary E. Gaither), let Joseph Blackwell-- both of Rowan Co., N.C.--have 114 acres on both sides of Poplar Draft, beginning on the corner of lots #4 & #3 at a stone heap in an old field & going south with the line of lot #3 2 degrees east 62 chains & 65 links to a post oak on the corner of lot #3, north 88 degrees east 18 chains & 28 links to a small hickory on the corner of lot #1, north with the line of lot #1, (now owned by Matthew S. Locke), then south with the line of lot #4 88 degrees west 18 chains & 28 links to the beginning, it being lot #2 in the estate of deceased Eli Gaither.

Book 28 page 503: On Nov. 29 1824, Edwin N. Gaither of Putnam Co. Ga.--no wife signs--lets George Locke of Rowan Co. N.C., have 90 acres next James Huie for \$225.00, witnessed by John M. McConnaughey & John F. Cowan & proved in Feb. 1826 by Jno. M. McConnaughey. (This is part of a tract belonging to the heirs of deceased --- Gaither).

Book 20 page 466: On Nov. 3 1808, Eli Gaither--no wife signs--lets Montgomery Newnan. (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 202 acres next Montgomery Newnan, --- Hughes, a branch, & Henry Horah for (no money but) what was willed by Dr. Anthony Newnan to his son the said Montgomery Newnan, witnessed by Henry Chambers & D.W. Nesbit & proved in Aug. 1815. (This 202 acres is part of a tract granted by The State to Thomas Vickers who let Dr. Anthony Newnan have it & he willed it "to me Eli Gaither").

Book 20 page 465; Nov. 4 1808, Montgomery Newnan--no wife signs--lets John Fulton (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have the above land for \$404.00 & this makes void another conveyance of the same land made to the said John on June 20 1807, witnessed by D.W. Nesbit & Henry Chambers & proven by the latter in Aug. 1815. (Willed to Capt. Eli Gaither by Dr. Anthony Newnan).

N.C.--have 201 acres on Mirey Branch of Crane Creek next --- Hughes at the west corner of the land which Dr. Anthony Newnan bought of Thomas Vickers, in a bottom & crossing a branch, for \$249.00, witnessed & proved by James Locke in Nov. 1811.

(This is in division of the heirs-at-law of Eli Gaither

Book 10 page 521: March 27 1785, The State grants (#80) of the confiscated land of H.E. McCulloh) to Anthony Newnan for 227 pounds, tract #26 on Swearing Creek next tract #25 & Hugh Cunningham

Book 10 page 521: , The State grants (#84) of the confiscated land being tract #25 next tract #24, on Whitakers Branch, to Anthony Newnan.

Book 8 page 299: July 1 1773, John Mitchell, a merchant of Meldrum? Province, S.C.--no wife signs--lets Dr. Anthony Newman of Salisbury N.C., have 24 acres with allowance for roads in the south square of Salisbury, crossing Crane Creek, for 35 pounds, witnessed by David Nasbit & Ad. Osborn & proved by the latter in Nov. 1774.

Book 8 page 300: Oct. 22 1773, Hugh Montgomery, a merchant--no wife signs--lets Dr. Anthony Newman (both of Salisbury, N.C.) have 216 sq. poles or the upper parts of lots 2 & 10 in the east square of the town, fronting on Main St. 9 poles & 24 poles back (next lots 1 & 9 for 500 pounds, witnessed by James Kerr & Esq. Alexander Martin & proved by the latter in Nov. 1774. (This is really parts of three lots which the trustees of the town let Peterl Merrand have, & he & wife Catherine let Conrad Michahave & his heir-at-law & attorney, Conrad Carn let said Hugh Montgomery have).

Book 7 page 423: May 31 1768, Robert Johnston, a hatter & wife Mary let Dr. Anthony Newman have lot #2 in the south square being the upper half or 72 sq.poles (6 poles fronting on Corbin St. & 12 poles back), for 20 pounds, witnessed by James McMeachan & John Johnston & proved by the latter witness on March 14 1772.

Book 20 page 177: Sept. 11 1809, John Newman of Davidsen Co. Tenn.---no wife signs--lets George Fisher of Rowan Co. N.C., have 72 sq. poles or 1/2 of lot #1 in the great south square being the 1/4 which descended to me & the 1/4 with the houses which I bought of my brether, (Montgomery Newman) for \$1800.00, witnessed by John Randle & proved by Richard G. Davidsen of Montgomery Co. N.C. on Sept. 3 1810.

N.C.---no wife signs--lets Montfort Stokes of N.C., have 72 sq. poles or 1/2 of lot #1 in the great south square (being the 1/4 which descended to John Newman & the 1/4 which he bought of his brether Montgomery Newman with the houses & let said Fisher have) for \$1800.00, witnessed by Ed Jones & Thomas L. Newnan & proved by the latter in Nov. 1811.

BOOK 10 page 521: March 24 1785, The State grants (#80) to Anthony Newman 200 acres in tract #26 of Henry Eustace McCulloh on Swearing Creek next tract #25, for 227 pounds.

Book 10 page 521: The State grants (#84) to Anthony Newman 75 acres on Whitakers Branch for 224 pounds.

Aug. 6 1808: Montfort Stokes vs John Newman for the division of lot #1 in the south square of town. The defendant's appeal is granted.

Book 20 page 272: Oct. 15 1811, Montfort Stokes of Wilkes Co. N.C.---no wife signs--lets Them as L. Cawan of Rowan Co. N.C., 144 sq. poles of lot #1 in the great south square with the houses, for \$3500.00, witnessed by Michael Brown & Jehn L. Henderson & proved by the latter in Nov. 1811. (These descended to John, Hugh & Montgomery Newman from their mether, Mary, wife of Dr. Anthony Newman).

Book 8 page 301: Oct. 22 1773, Hugh Montgomery, a merchant of Rowan Co.N.C. lets John Newman & Hugh Newman (sons of Dr. Anthony Newman) have to be equally divided between them, 543 acres in the fork of Beaver Dam Branch of Grants Creek next Mr McCulloh crossing a branch, for 500 pounds (paid by said John & Hugh Newman), witnessed by James Kerr & Esq. Alexander Martin & proved by the latter in Nov. 1774. (Earl Granville let John Dickey have this & he let said Hugh Montgomery have it).

: Lease & release from John Dickey & wife Rachael to Hugh Montgomery for 543 acres Oct. 9-10 1765 is proved.

Book 6 page 208: Oct. 9 1765, John Dickey, a "Gunsmith and Rachel his Wife" let Hugh Montgomery, a gentleman--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 543 acres in the fork of Beaver Dam Branch of Grants Creek next Mr. McCulloh & crossing a branch, for 5 shillings--the release price being 50 pistoles on the next day--witnessed by John Bravard, Ephraim Bravard & Adam Bravard & acknowledged in Oct. 1765. (Earl Granville let John Dickey have this by sale on Feb. 22 1759).

Book 18 page 1022: Nov. 1 1803, John Newman & Hugh Newman --let Maxwell Chambers (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 543 acres on fork of Beaver Dam Branch of Grants Creek next Mr. McCulloh & crossing a branch, for 500 pounds, witnessed & proved by Ls. Beard in Feb. 1804. (Earl Granville let John Dickey have this on Feb. 22 1759, he let Hugh Montgomery have it & he devised it to the said John & Hugh Newman by will).

The will of Maxwell Chambers Sr. (book G page 133) made July 5 1809 & probated in Wife Margaret (she may have succeeded another of the same name?). Sons: Edward, Samuel (who is under age), Joseph, Henry, John, Maxwell, Otho & Thomas. Daughters: Anna (wife of Henry Chambers Sr.) for whom Edward is to act as trustee, & Margaret Newman (wife of Dr. John Newman of Tenn). Grandson Henry Augustus (son of deceased William Chambers)

Book 32 page 337: Dec. 22 1834, Anna Miller pays John A. Maroney \$50.00 for the first two years at which she hopes the litigation over the will may be over. then \$35.00 yearly until & appoints him for \$5.00 to see that Dr. John Newman's wife, her sister, shall have all that is necessary for her maintainance, but should said Maroney die or leave the State, she reserves the right to appoint someone else to attend to this matter, witnessed & proved by Lewis H. Garner.

Marriage bond: Anna Chambers to George Miller June 13 1822 signed by Charles Fisher.

Book 30 page 381: Oct. 17 1827, whereas George Miller married Anne (the daughter of Maxwell Chambers of Rowan Co.N.C. who died intestate owning about 20 acres near the race grounds in the vicinity of Salisbury, the sister of John Chambers (who also died intestate owning the Spring Hill tract & other lands leaving an only son child called Matthew F. who also died intestate while a minor), also the sister of Joseph Chambers (who too died intestate), so Archibald G.C

Newnan & proved by the latter in Nev. 1811.

(This is part of the estate of Dr Newman sold according to his will).

Book 27 page 113: July 4 1822, John Newman (as the surviving executor of deceased Anthony Newman) of Davidson Co. Tenn. lets George Vogler of Rowan Co. N.C., have lots 35, 36, 43 & 44 in the great east square of Salisbury, for \$80.00, witnessed by Edward Cress & John Utzman & proved by the latter in Feb. 1822.

Book 19 page 23: May 26 1804, Esq. John Brown as surviving Exr. of decd Hugh Montgomery Sr. of Salisbury N.C. lets Anthony Newman of Salisbury have as highest bidder at the sale in Nov. 1787? by another executor, David Nesbit, for 227 pounds & 17 shillings; lots #9, 28 (near tanyard lot), 25, 26, 34, 35, 43, 44, 52, 53, 60, 61 & 62 in east square #27 in south square "termed the pond lott" & 4 others outside town chequers on left hand of road leading from courthouse southwest, including where said Hugh is buried

Book 23 page 763: May 17 1816, George Rymer (a German & no wife signs) mortgages? to Henry Hileigh & Henry Coon--all of --- 100 acres on Crane Creek next Daniel Clary for \$250.00 (which they must pay with interest to John Fulton by Nov. 4 1808), witnessed by David Gardiner & Robert Morgan & proven by the latter in May 1816. (This is part of the 202 acres conveyed by Montgomery Newman to John Fulton on Nov. 4 1808--see book 20 page 465) It begins on the northwest corner of the original at a hickory & goes east 15 chains to a red oak, south 60 chains & 18 links to a black oak on the line of Daniel Clary, west with it 21 chains & 70 links to a stake on an original corner, north 14 chains & 68 links to a black oak, east 60 chains & 70 links to a black Jack, then north to the beginning.

Book 17 page 143: Nov. 9 1799, William Vickers of Lincoln Co. N.C., Alexander Vickers, Ann Vickers & Henry Carson of Rowan Co. N.C., as heirs of deceased Thomas Vickers, let Anthony Newman of Salisbury, N.C., have 210 acres on Crane Creek near Salisbury, next Joseph Hughes, Hugh Waddle, that part of the tract sold by Thomas Vickers to Anthony Newman on May 12 1792, John Gardner, John Dunn & Hugh Montgomery, for 160 pounds, witnessed by John Fullenwider (as to Wm. Book 20 page 465: Nov. 4, 1804, Montgomery Newman--no wife signed--let John Fulton, (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), have 202 acres beginning at a black oak on the line of Eli Gaither & the corner of --- Hughes, & goes with the line which was --- Hughes west 32 chains to a hickory on the corner of Eli Gaither, south 45 chains & 50 links to a black Jack, west 6 chains to a black Jack on the side of a branch, south 14 chains & 68 links to a stake on the line of Henry Horah, east with the same 38 chains & 70 links to a hickory, then north to the beginning, for \$404.00, witnessed by D. W. Nesbit & Henry Chambers & proved by the latter on June 20, 1807. (This deed makes void another conveyance of the same land to the said John Fulton on June 20, 1807, & is part of a State Grant to Thomas Vickers who let Dr. Anthony Newman have, who willed it to Captain Eli Gaither who let Montgomery Newman have it.)
 May 4 1808: Administration on the estate of Hugh Newman is granted to Eli Gaither who gave bond of 3000 pounds with Nicholas Gaither & John Fulton as security.

Feb. 10 1810: Administration de bonus non on the estate of deceased Hugh Newman issued to John Fulton who gave bond of 1000 pounds with George Fisher & George Bettz.

Book 11 page 659: July 11, 1788, The State granted (#1720 at 50 shillings the 100 acres), to Thomas Vickers 411 acres on the Waters of Crane Creek, beginning at a small black oak next Joseph Hughes & the line of Hugh Waddle, & going with the line of Hughes west 44 chains & 25 links to a black oak, west with his line again 31 chains & 50 links to a hickory on the corner of Edward Hill, south with his line 44 chains to a black Jack, west 6 chains & 50 links to a black Jack, --- 14 chains & 50 links to a stake in the line of Henry Horah, east with his line 38 chains to a hickory in the line of John Gardner, north with his line 14 chains & 50 links to a small black oak, east 21 chains to a stake on the corner of John Dunn, north with the line of Dunn 35 chains & 50 links to a stake, north with his line again 40 degrees east 13 chains to a black Jack oak on the corner of Hugh Montgomery, north with his line 42 chains to a hickory on the corner of Hugh Waddle, then with his line to the beginning.

Book 19 page 722: April 19 1806, the executors of deceased Dr. Anthony Newman of Rowan Co.N.C.(Lewis Beard, Maxwell Chambers, John Newman & Eli Gaither) let John Newman--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 340 acres on Poplar Branch of Grants Creek next John Todd & --- Allison, for \$1020.00, witnessed & proved by Thomas L.Cowan in May 1806.

Book 19 page 711: May 1 1806, said executors let John Trexler--all of Rowan Co.N.C.-- have lot #9 in the east square of Salisbury; also #28 in said square below Michael Brown's tan-yard, --the first for \$380.00 & 2d for \$50.00--witnessed & proved by Thomas Cowan in May 1806. (These three tracts were willed to be sold).

Coweta Co. Chronicle (published in Atlanta, Ga. 1928, page 53, by Mary G. Jones & Lily Reynolds) The town of Newman, located in Feb. 1828, named in honor of Gen. Daniel Newman, son of Dr. Anthony Newman whose will of 1805 in in Rowan Co.N.C., & two deeds in Rowan from Daniel Newman of Green Co.Ga.(for a lot in Salisbury to Hugh Newman on Apr. 28 1806 other from Daniel Newman of Putnam Co.Ga. on Feb. 17 1817). The Librarian of Congress gives: "Daniel Newman was born in North Carolina about 1780. He was commissioned Ensign and Second Lieutenant in the Fourth U.S. Infantry, March 3 1779, was promoted to be First Lieutenant the following November, and Resigned January 1, 1801". He commanded the Ga. volunteers as Capt. of the militia in 1812, promoted, wounded in 1813 &c. After the war he lived near McDonough, Henry Co., Ga., became Adjutant Gen. of State Militia in 1812 & Brig-Gen. in 1813, Major-Gen. in 1817 of the third division of State Militia, Principal Keeper of the Penitentiary in 1823, Secretary of State in 1825, Congressman 1831-33. He died Jan. 16 1851 in Walker (now Catoosa Co.) Ga. near the Tennessee line & the Chicamauga battlefield. He was alone on Peavine Ridge in search of health when he died & was buried three miles off, at Newman Springs (containing about 7 acres) but no tombstone was erected & nothing of his family seems now known. Another town, Newmanville, in Pike Co. Ga. was named for him. He is said to have tried promoting silk culture in Henry County.

In Salisbury N.C. courthouse is a letter written on Nov. ^{1st} 1813 to Capt. John Fulton by Daniel Newman while at Eatonton, Ga. in which he states he is joining the army against the Creek Indians as Adjutant & Inspector General & in case of his death wants Captain John Fulton to act as his executor & leaves everything to his own little children, but desires Mary to have a double portion. Speaks of authorities at Pensacola, St. Marks & c. Wednesday May 4 1808: Administration on the estate of deceased Hugh Newman is granted to Eli Gaither who gave bond of 3000 pounds with Nicholas Gaither & John Fulton

Book 19 page 646: Nov. 25 1805, Montgomery Newman of --no wife signs (a son of Anthony Newman & wife Mary who was Mary Montgomery) lets Dr. John Newman of Salisbury N.C., have lot #1 in the great south square of the down (which is now occupied by the said Dr.) being 144 sq. poles, for \$625.00, witnessed by John Steele & Max Chambers & proved by the latter in May 1806. (This came through father's will and from Do ? Carson to my mother before her marriage).

Book 20 page 177: Sept. 11 1809, John Newman of Davidson Co. Tenn. ---no wife signs---lets George Fisher of Rowan Co. N.C., have 72 sq. poles of lot #1 in the great south square, for \$1800.00, witnessed by John Randle & Richmond G. Davidson of Montgomery Co. N.C. on Sept. 3 1810. (One quarter of this came by inheritance & the other quarter was bought of brother Montgomery Newman).

(Both Thomas & Alice Vickers sign their names & this is part of the grant from The State on July 11, 1788 to him).
