Major John Gale was an Original Member of The Society of The Cincinnati of Maryland - see page 298 of The Kentucky Year Book of 1913, which contains a list.

Rowan Co. K.C., Book 9 page 140: Jan. 1, 1768, Samuel Blythe & wife Sarah let William McC Knight - all of Rowan Co. K.C. -

- have 250 acres on the southeast side of Blythes Creek, beginning on the east side of the said Creek at a red willow bush & going east 48 poles to a hickory by a fence of Jacob Nichols on the corner of the original corner of the said Blythe's old original survey, going with line (called a R. line in his old deed), south $3^{\circ} E$ 22 poles to a white oak
- on the corner of David McC Dowell, west with his line 96 1/2 poles to a stake near a marked B.C. sapling, south 52 poles to a stake on the corner of Tom McC Dole's, west with his line 162 poles to a B.C. on the line of James Blythe, (about 2 poles south of a marked W.C. on the east side of the said creek), then down the meanders of the said creek to the beginning,
- for 5 shillings, - The release price being 95 pounds, 16 shillings & 8 pence on the same day - witnessed by Sarah Braly & John Braly & proved by the latter in Feb. term of 1752. (This was originally granted the said Samuel Blythe on March 25, 1752).

Feb. Court 1752: Deed of Lease & release from Samuel Blythe & wife to William McC Knight for 250 acres dated Jan. 1, 1768, proved by John Braly & registered

Book 23 page 732: Sept. 16 1815, Thomas Cox Jr.--no wife signs--lets John Frost (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 3 1/2 acres on Dutchmans Creek next John Johnston. James McClahan, Mary Johnson, Thomas Cox Sr. & John Stevenson, for \$36.00, witnessed by Benjamin Garner & Samuel Edwards & proved by the latter in May 1816

Book 71 page 294: Oct. 10 1889, A.W. Osborne & wife Sarah M. let Elizabeth N. Galimere--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 149 feet in the south ward of Salisbury, at the intersection of Clay & Fisher streets going to ---Osborn's, then 50 ft. parallel to Fisher St. next Mrs. Gales', then parallel to Clay St. 149 ft. to Fisher St., then southeast with Fisher St. &c. for \$125.00, acknowledged on the same day. (This had formerly been owned by Willie Gales).

Book 64 page 464: Feb. 4 1885, William B. Howard & wife Margretta B., Daniel S. Sides & wife Annie W. let W.W. Gales--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 1 1/8 acre, (being their undivided half of it, but subject to the dower of Barbara A.W.B. Gales, the widow of deceased William F. Gales) for \$200.00, acknowledged on the same day. (William F. Gales got this of the commissioners, Robert Murphey & Andrew Murphey on Feb. 22 1872).

Mr. John I. Shaver says (1935) that Barbara Gales had a boy Will who clerked in Helmes' store, married Mollie (daughter of Henry Cauble) & moved to Tenn.; a daughter, Mollie, who married Benjamin Blackwell & had a child killed on the railroad; another, Annie, who married Dan Sides & had twins (one married Grimes & one)
& married ---Powell; a son Charles who lives in Washington D.C.; & Maggie who married & had a girl. Her home was on Innis St. a man from Charlotte Osborne got her home

Mr. Jeremiah Brown had a sister Mrs. Peggy Dixon who lived on E. Innis St. Salisbury who had a daughter Barbara who married Gales.

(This is part of lot #18 bought by said Harrison of R. & A. Murphey who were commissioners of the estate of deceased Mary Murphy).

Book 65 page 60: Aug. 7 1885, William W.Gales & wife Mary R. let Eliza L.Ridenhour--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have $\frac{1}{2}$ acre on the corner of Inness & Caldwell St. going east to John West's then with Caldwell St. southeast 100 feet, then with West 200 feet to Inniss St., then 100 feet with Inniss St., for \$900.00, acknowledged on Aug. 7 1885. (John S.Henderson as the trustee of Mary R.Gales had Feb. 15 1882--see book 60 page 558). *See App. Buch - Brown*

Book 70 page 288: Aug. 3 1888, W.W.Gales & wife Mary R. let Rev. F.J.Murdock--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have part of lot # in the south ward of Salisbury (& lot #44 in the Smithdeal map 306 at intersection of Clay & Horah streets, for \$1.00

May 19 1827: Thomas Ferreebe is appointed guardian of William, the orphan of Thomas Gales

Joseph Gales

Wake County N.C.History by Hope Chamberlain, page 131; Joseph Gales, an Englishman, came to America with Dr. Priestly & was connected with him) to Philadelphia, Pa. Later Gales came to Raleigh & edited "The Register" and still later he became the State printer. His wife, Winnifred ---, wrote the first novel printed in North Carolina she died in 1839 followed two years later by her husband.

N.C.History (Lewis) Vol.II page 52; Joseph Gales, an English radical, forced to leave his native home, arrived in Philadelphia in 1795, was an expert reporter of Congressional proceedings, &c. He became editor of the Raleigh Register (established in 1799) got entangled with the law &c. His son, Joseph Jr. edited the paper--he had a brother William W.Gales.--see more of them

Book 88 page 183; April 12 1900, Kate C. Frontis of Iredell Co. N.C. let James C. Jamison, Winslow S. Jamison & William M. Jamison of Rowan Co. N.C., have 130 acres next J.C. Gray, C.K. McNeely, Joseph F. McLean for \$1500.00.

Book 25 page 149: James McLean of Cabarrus Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets William Williford of Rowan Co. N.C., have 61 1/2 acres on Coddle Creek next --- Beaty. --- Wood & --- Hughes, for \$450.00, witnessed by John McLean & Hu Braly & proved by the latter in Feb. 1819. (This is lot #1 out of the estate of deceased William McLean which was allotted to his legatees although he died intestate, & came to the said James) Nov. 4 1806: Administration on the estate of deceased William McLean is granted to Hugh Braly & John McLean who gave bond of 3000 pounds with James Cochran & Lewis Beard, &c.

Book 9 page 46: July 1 1779, The State grants (#28 at the 100 acres) to William & David (the sons of deceased James Jamison) 640 acres on Coddle Creek next David Kerr, Joseph Dickson, George Fleming & Hugh Park's Creek.

May 6 1786: Deed from William & David Jamison to John Jamison for a part of 133 acres on April 20 1786 proved by Jno. Braly.

The will of John M. Jamison (book K page 283) made Aug. 18 1847 & probated in May 1860. Wants a tombstone erected to deceased wife Margaret. Nephews & nieces: Margaret Braley, Elizabeth Wier, Hugh M. & James Sloan, Mary A., Sarah M., George M. & Margaret L. McKnight, the daughter of Tirzah McKee, heirs of sister Eleanor Wilford, probably the heirs of Jane Cochran & heirs of Mary Morton, Jane Hope's two daughters, heirs of John McKnight (Ezekiel, Thomas, James, John, Nancy & Margaret) & heirs of brother James. N.C.) have 86 1/2 acres on Blythes Creek next James Jamison & Charles Down, crossing the creek, for \$386.00, witnessed by Hugh Braly & Alexander M. Hughs & acknowledged in Aug. 1823. (This being lot #3 in the estate of deceased William Erwin Jr. who died intestate, next lots 1 & 2, which was allotted to them, Margaret L. or S. being one of the heirs).

Book 28 page 478: --- 1825, Colonel James Jamison gives to the trustees of Prospect Church & their successors, 5 acres next Jamison on the old line including the Meeting House & Study House, for one cent, witnessed by Samuel McNeely & John Graham & proved by the latter in Feb. 1826. (The trustees were David Beaty, Hugh Braly & Thomas Steele).

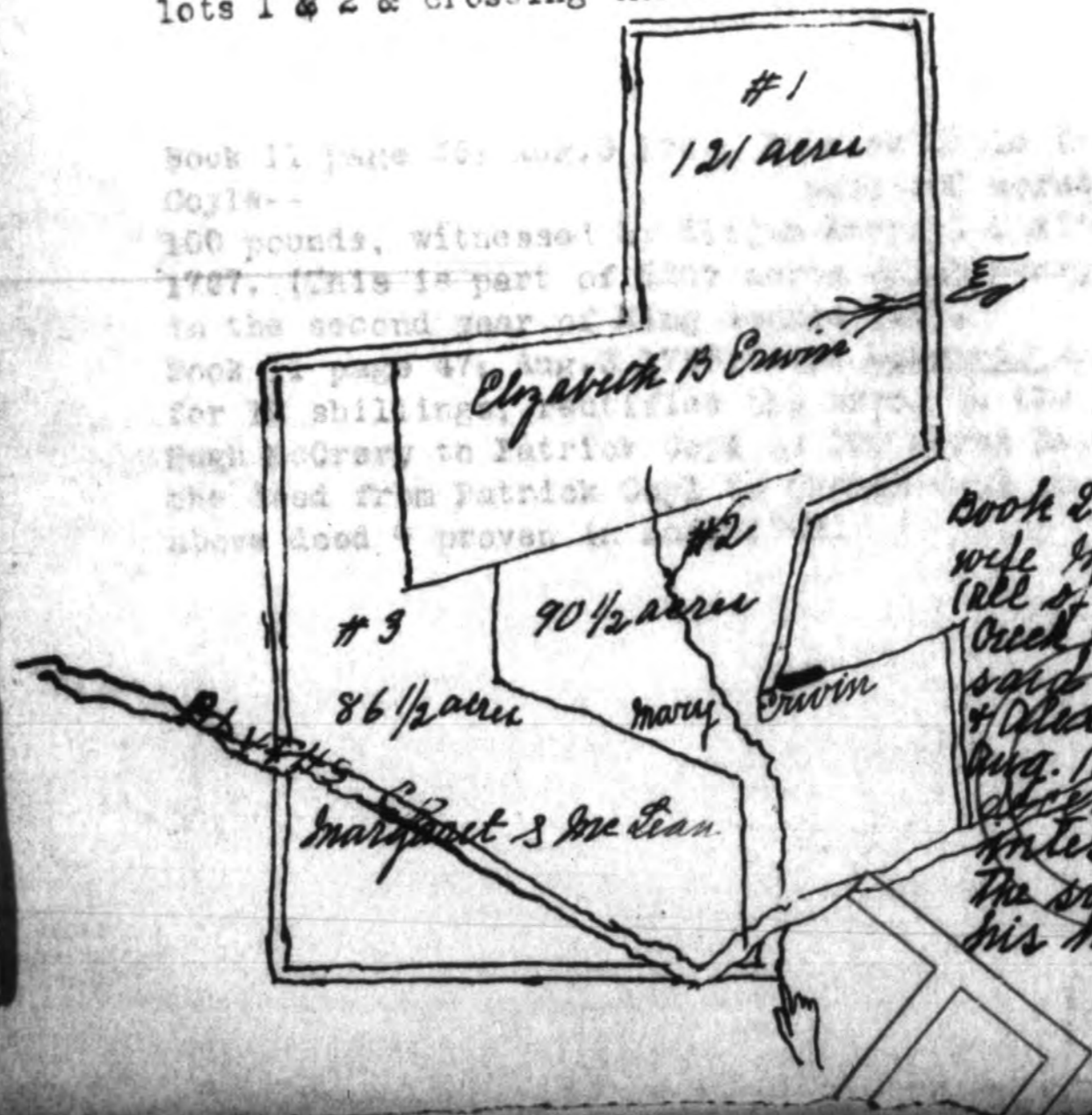
Feb. 15 1814: William H. Kerr as first major & James Jamison as second major, took their oaths in the Rowan Militia.

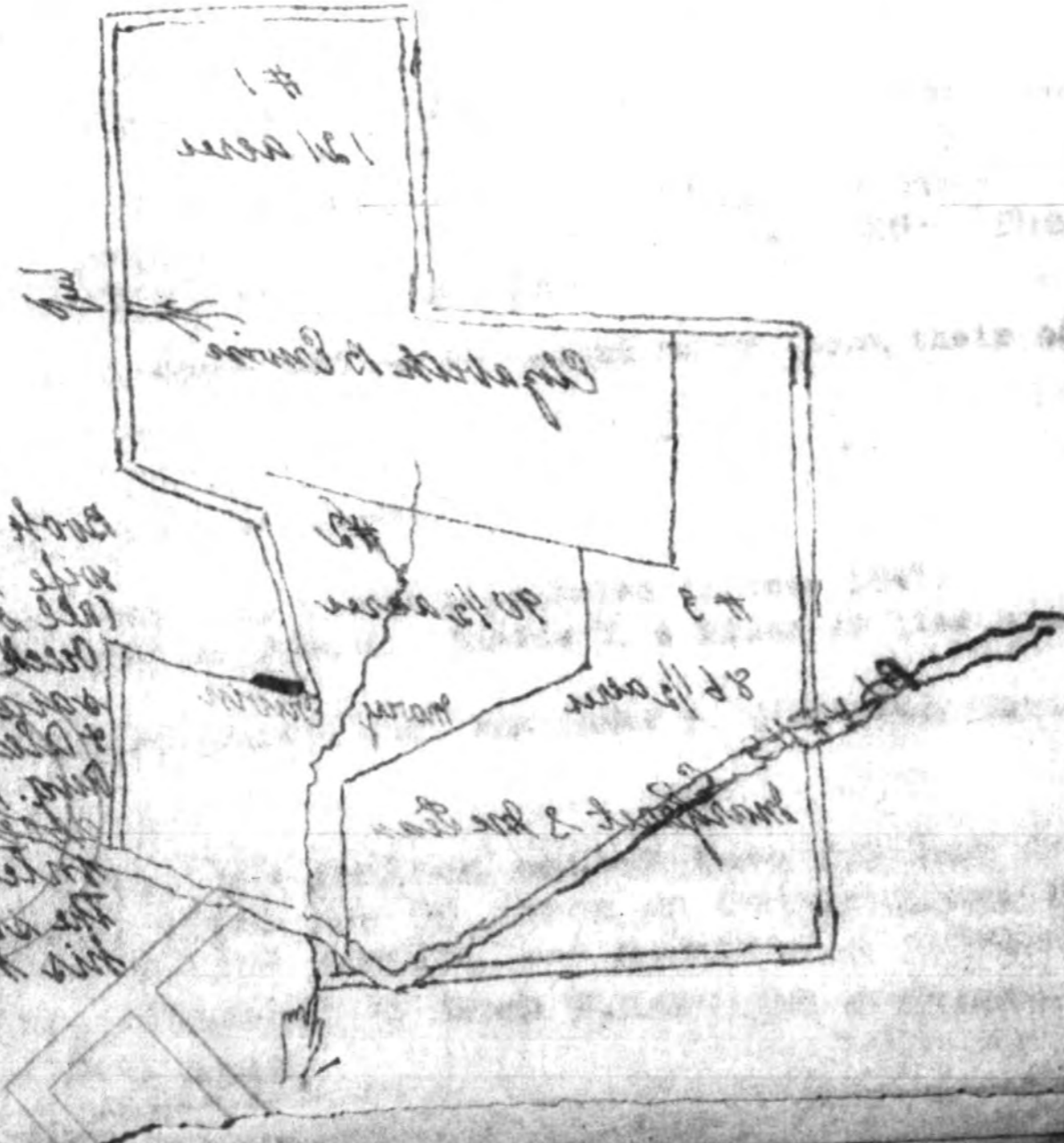

N.C.) have 86 1/2 acres on Blythes Creek next James Jamison & Charles Downs, crossing the creek, for \$386.00, witnessed by Hugh Braly & Alexander M. Hughs & acknowledged in Aug. 1823. (This is lot #3 in the estate of the deceased William Erwin Jr. who died intestate allotted them next lots #1 & 2 the said Margaret S or L being one of his heirs.)

Division of land page 38: The estate of William Young, Jr. is divided by William H. Kerr, John M. Jamison, John Graham, James Jamison by order of court with John Andrews as commissioner & returned to nov. court of 1812.

Lot #1 goes to Elizabeth E. Irwin & is 121 acres next John Graham, Charles Downs, lots #2 & #3 by the edge of the old field & Mrs. Jamison.

Lot #2 of 90 1/2 acres goes to Mary Irwin & is next James Jamison, Mrs. Jamison & her field.

Lot #3 goes to James E. Jamison & is 3 1/2 acres on edge of field next James Jamison, Mrs. Jamison & her field.

Irwin (all of them) for James Jamison, Charles Downs, Mary Irwin & Mrs. Jamison & their heirs & assigns the land described in the above deed & is 121 acres next John Graham, Charles Downs, lots #2 & #3 by the edge of the old field & Mrs. Jamison.

Book 11 page 38: Aug. 3 1787, Patrick Coyle (makes his mark & no wife signs) lets Thomas Coyle-- have 100 acres on Abbotts Creek next Michael Younger, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Elijah Merrell & Michael Treacey & proven by the latter in Aug. 1787. (This is part of 520 1/2 acres which Henry McCulloch sold to Hugh McCrery on Dec. 19 in the second year of King George III).

Book 11 page 47: Aug. 3 1787, Boyd McCrerey as an heir & executor of deceased Hugh McCrery, for 10 shillings, rectifies the error in the lease & release made on Feb. 6-7 1767 from Hugh McCrery to Patrick Coyl of 100 acres having the wrong description as will appear in the deed from Patrick Coyl to Thomas Coyl on Aug. 3 1787. witnessed by the same as in the above deed & proven in Aug. 1787.
