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Book 27 page 387:----- Edward Yarborough lets Ezra Allemong have 229 acres on Middle Fork of Crane Creek next Jacob Fisher & Thomas Mull (which Henry Carson conveyed to the deceased Edward Yarborough); also a tract in Georgia (which is not described here but had belonged to my father & was divided among his heirs); also five negroes

Book 29 page 130: Nov. 20 1823, Ezra Allemong (by a deed of trust from Edward Yarbrough on Feb. 19 1823) as trustee lets Thomas Mull--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 186.37 acres on Crane Creek next Jacob Fisher, Thomas Mull, Thomas Cowan, --- Utzman & Moses A. Locke for \$800.00, witnessed by George Locke & William Brown & acknowledged by said E. Yarbrough on Jan. 19 1824 & said Allemong in Nov. 1826.

Feb. 1821: "Ezra Allemong appointed Administrr. of the estate of Adam Srote and he gave bond with Moses A Locke in \$ 3000--- and he qualified and obtained letters"

Feb. 1821: "Ezra Allemong appointed guardian of Jacob, David & Margaret Coughenhaur---Christian Coughenhaur heirs and he gave bond with Moses A. Locke in 1000.--each--"

Land-entry book: On a loose leaf of this book, Henry Allemong is Entry Taker of Rowan Co.N.C. & certifies as to some land (#376, of 108 or 180 acres) had been entered by G.W. & J.S.Pearson on the South Yadkin River next land of Joseph Pearson of Virginia & the heirs of Richmond Pearson Sr. in Aug. 17 1827 and that a claim was set up on Nov. 17 1827 by William Moore. This was witnessed by Daniel Wallon & G.W.Pearson.

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Book 22 page 648 or 748 (numbered twice): Feb. 28 1806, Elizabeth <sup>Allamong</sup>Allamong lets William Peain (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres on Reedy Creek next James Chaney & --- Painter, for 28 pounds, witnessed by John Brinkley & John Periman & proved by the latter in May 1813. (This is some granted land).

Book 19 page 138: Dec. 1- 1799, William Pain of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Elizabeth Allemong of --- have 100 acres on Reedy Creek next James Chaney, for 28 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Rice & John Hampton & proved by the latter in Aug. 1805. (The State granted this to the said William Pain on Nov. 27 1793).

Book 26 page 777: June 14 1821, John Cooper--no wife signs--lets Allemong & Locke--all of Salisbury N.C.--have his right in the land of his father, Barnabas Cooper, for \$70.28, witnessed by Thomas A. Frohock & Hy. Giles \* proved by the latter in Nov. 1821.

Book 27 page 439: Aug. 20 1822, Ezra Allemong & George Locke let Charles Fisher & wife Christina--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have part of lot #9 in the great north square (33 feet or 2 poles frontage & 12 poles deep next the half lot #9 formerly owned by Lewis Beard who willed it to his daughter Christina Fisher), for \$200.00, acknowledged in Feb. 1823. (Benjamin Cowan sold this to said Allemong & Locke).

Book 27 page 437: Feb. 15 1823, Dr. Joseph Mangelberg lets Ezra Allemong & George Locke of the firm Allemong & Locke have (as in a settlement with said firm he is indebted \$184.53 & they have become responsible for two executions now in the hands of the Deputy Sheriff, Andrew Hunt for \$6162<sup>1</sup> in favor of John Fulton & x.) have 171 acres on Dutch Second Creek next John Waller, John Shuman, the old tract of old Peter Cauble, Adam Snider on the north side of a branch, witness by Samuel Lemly & William Howard who proved in Feb. 1823.

Nov. 8 1786: "Barnet Bowers, Orphan of James Bowers, being fourteen years old, is bound to Fredrick Alleman till he attain 21 Years of Age, to learn the Trade of a Sadler Master to comply with the Law & c and further to give his Apprentice a Set of Sadler Tools or six Pounds at the Experation of his Time"

May 10 1788: "Ordered that Fredrick Allemong pay Jeane Bowers at the rate of 10. P An. since the birth of her child of which he is the repited Father"

May 9 1788: Fredrick Allemong qualified as Constable and gave approved security.

Friday, May 15 1812: Administration on the estate of deceased Frederick Allemong is granted to Henry Allemong who gave bond of 50 pounds with George Metz.



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Book 14 page 105 or 205: On Nov. 21 1792, Frederick Allemon a sadler--no wife signs--lets David Miller, a hatter (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 48 sq. poles of lot #6 in the east square of Salisbury (4 poles on Corbin St.), for 30 pounds, witnessed by Jos. Chambers & John Beard & acknowledged in Nov.1795.

Book 14 page 264: On --- -- 1796, David Miller, a hatter--no wife signs--lets Peter Fultz, a cooper (both men of Salisbury, N.C.) have 1/4 of lot #6, on Corbin St. in the east square of the town (36 sq. poles), for 30 pounds, witnessed by John Hampton & George Dunn & acknowledged in Feb. 1796.

Book 17 page 366: June 3 1800, Peter Fultz, a cooper (Catharine also) let Samuel Hughes, a carpenter--both of Salisbury, N.C., have 1/4 or 36 sq. poles of lot #6 in the east square of Salisbury on Corbin St., for 200 pounds, witnessed by Francis Coupee & George Miller & proved by the latter in Aug. 1800.

May 15 1812: Administration on the estate of deceased Frederick Allemong is granted to Henry Allemong who gave bond of 50 pounds with George Bets

Book 19 page 215: March -- 1805, Esq. George Fisher as high-sheriff lets John Blair of Guilford Co.N.C. (on an execution against Frederick Allemong for 150 pounds, 18 shillings & 7 pence recovered by Hugh Campbell & others, with costs, ordered sold & was sold March 22 1805) now delivers for 250 pounds to said Blair, 60 sq poles of lot #6 in the great east square of Salisbury, beginning on north corner of Corbin St. going southeast to lot #14, then southwest with said lot to Samuel Hughes, then north west with said Hughes to Corbin St. witness

Book 23 page 277: Aug 10 1819, Esq. Alexander Graham as high-sheriff of the county (on an execution against Henry Allemong for 101 pounds & shillings & 6 pence recovered by Thomas Todd & land sold on Feb. 19 1819) to Henry Allemong for \$150.00, 30 acres (which had been owned by the deceased William H. Stradford) next to said lot #6, on Corbin St. George Bets, Thomas Anderson, Thomas Pinkston & John Gibson, witnesses by Thomas Todd & Allemong & acknowledged in May 1820.

Aug.2 1808: Henry Allimong age 12 years & 3 mos is bound to John Smather to learn the trade of a hatter

Thursday, Nov.6 1800: Nancy Allimong is bound to John Hampton for 4 years

**Minutes of 1828: Henry & Nancy Allemong get a divorce**

Feb. 1818: On hearing the petition of Ezra Allemong against John Springs & wife & Moses A. Locke for the partition of the land on the Yadkin River which belonged to deceased Evan Alexander when he died, it is ordered that Joseph Chambers, Anderson Ellis, Peter Smith, Adam Srote & Jesse Hargrave act as a commission to divide it.



May 7 1802 Minutes: " Henry Allemong Orphan of Danl. Allemong being 5 years Old bound to Saml. Hughes Housejoiner till he arive to the age of 21 Master Comply with the Law".

Book 28 page 520: April 14 1826, William Pinkston Jr. a blacksmith makes Ezra Allemong (both of Salisbury N.C.) a deed of trust for \$20.00, the negro Sarah aged six or seven years, lots & houses \$65 & 66 in the east square of the town,  $\frac{1}{4}$  of lots #73 & 74 & the houses & lots where said Pinkston now lives, as said Allemong has endorsed a note of \$200.00 witnessed by H. V. Parker & G. H. Brule & proved by the latter in May 1826.

Book 19 page 91: Nov. 24 1804, Frederick Allamong, a sadler, mortgages to Peter Brown, a merchant (both of Salisbury N.C.) that part of lot #6 in the east square of said town where said Allamong now lives being 5 poles front & 12 poles back including the house, kitchen & stable, for 102 pounds, witnessed by Henry Giles & acknowledged in Feb. 1805.

Book 19 page 215: March -- 1805, Esq. George Fisher as high-sheriff of Rowan (on an execution against Frederick Allemong for 160 pounds, 18 shillings & 7 pence recovered by Hugh Campbell & others, ordered to sell & did so March 22 1805) now delivers to John Blair of Guilford Co. N.C. for 250 pounds, 60 sq. poles of lot #6 in the great east square of Salisbury, beginning on the corner of Corbin St., going southeast to lot #14, then southwest with said lot to Samuel Hughes's lot, then northwest with said Hughes's lot to Corbin St., witnessed by A. Weatherly, & Peter Brown & acknowledged in May 1805.

Book 14 page 519 or 619 (numbered twice): May 2 1796, Frederic Allemong makes a deed of trust (he is a sadler of Salisbury) to Lewis Beard (a Dealer of same place) for that part of lot #6 in the east square of Salisbury including his house, kitchen & stable (5 poles frontage & 12 poles back), for 100 pounds, witnessed by Henry Giles & John Brandon & acknowledged in in Aug. 1796.

Book 13 page 157: Nov. 5 1792, Henry Fullenwider, (as heir-at-law of his brother, Jacob )no wife signs--lets Frederic Allemong (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 108 sq. poles of lot #6 in great east square of Salisbury on Corbin St., for 55 pounds, witnessed by David Miller & Max Chambers & proved by the latter.



May 7 1785: Deed from Robert Gillespie to Daniel? Alliman for part lot #2  
in south square Salisbury Nov. 6 1784 proved by Daniel Clairry.  
Book 10 page 179: Nov. 6 1784, Robert Gillespie, gentleman of Rowan Co. (no  
Daniel Alliman of Salisbury N.C., have 72 sq. poles on the southern part  
of lot # 12 in the south square of the town (next the other half which  
the attorney-at-law, John Dunn & wife Mary let 'Anthony Newnin Doctor  
of Phisic' have) 6 poles fronting Corbin St. & 12 poles back, for 60 pounds,  
witnessed by Jas. Craige, Richd. Jacques & Daniel Clary who proved in May 1785.  
Book 11 page 619: Nov. 20 1788, Daniel Allamong--no wife signs--lets Tobias  
Ferrar, a blacksmith--both men of Salisbury, N.C.--have 1/2 of lot #2 (72 sq.  
poles) on the southermost part in the south square of the town, (next the  
other half which the attorney-at-law, John Dunn & wife Mary let Dr. Anthony  
Newnan have), for 190 pounds, witnessed by Matt: Troy & Henry Giles & proved  
by the latter in Feb. 1789.

Book 28 page 520: April 14 1826, William Pinkston Jr. a blacksmith makes Ezra Allemong  
(both of Salisbury N.C.) a deed of trust for \$20.00, the negro Sarah aged six or seven  
years, lots & houses #65 & 66 in the east square of the town, 1/4 of lots #73 & 74 & the  
houses & lots where said Pinkston now lives, as said Allemong has endorsed a note of  
\$300.00, witnessed by H.Y.Parker & S.H.Braly & proved by the latter in May 1826.

Book 27 page 507: Feb.16 1822, Moses A.Locke & wife Mary let Ezra Allemong & George Locke--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have  $\frac{1}{4}$  lot #1 in the great north square (which Lewis Beard let his said daughter Mary have on May 22 1819); also  $\frac{1}{8}$  of said lot (which Aaron Jenkins Sr. deeded to Moses A.Locke on Feb. 20 1817) also another eighth (which next lot #9 & was conveyed to Aaron Jenkins Jr. to Moses A.Locke on Dec.2 1819)--in all  $\frac{1}{2}$  of said lot--for \$5000.00, acknowledged before Judge John Paxton & proved in April 1823.

Book 30 page 104: March 5 1828, Ezra Allemong--no wife signs--lets John Utzman (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have lots #41 & 42 in North square of Salisbury, for \$436.91, witnessed & proved by Henry Giles in May 1828.

Book 29 page 185: Nov.13 1826, Lewis Utzman being indebted to Ezra Allemong \$123.65 (exclusive of \$253.85 secured by George Locke on Dec.18 1824) lets his have in trust, where said utzman lives being lots #41 & 42 in the north square of Salisbury next James Hufe for 10 shillings, witnessed by Henry Giles & John H. Hardie & proved by the same
