ander Long on west side great road to Peter Gottle, next Michael Swink, for 140  
pounds, witnessed by Adam Shrode & Michael Troy who proved in May 1785. (see dead book)

Marriage bonds: Elizabeth Smith to Henry Folts Aug. 17 1790 signed Adam  
Shrode (test= C. Caldwell.  
Barbara Smith to Tobias Ferror Aug. 12 1790 signed Henry Sleighter (test=

Book 16 page 592: On May 24 1796, Frederic Low --signs like a foreigner & no  
wife signs--lets John Morris (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 150 acres on Lick  
Creek where said Low now lives next George Smith, for 70 pounds, witnessed by  
William & Lydia Ward & proved by William Ward in Aug. 1796. (This had been  
granted Frederick Low by Thomas Todd on May 6 1789).

Book 9 page 105: On Dec. 25 1779, Allen Parke & wife Elizabeth let Phinias  
Runyon have tract of 240 acres on waters of Cabin Creek, for 200 pounds,  
witnessed by Jonathan Davis & Ebenezer Parke & proved by Jonathan Davis in  
Feb. 1780. (This had been granted Allen Parke by deed from George Smith Sr.  
of Pennsylvania on Feb. 21 1767).  
April 14 1767: Deed from George Smith to Allein Park for 256 Acres on Feb. 21  
1767 is acknowledged; also same amounts to John Davis & Israel Cox for same  
amounts at same time.

Nov. 4 1795: "Peter Smith, orphan of Gasper being of lawful age, came into

Creek for 50 pounds, witnessed by Thos. Frohock & Jonathan Hunt approved Jan.  
Feb. 16 1768: Phillip Vable is appointed Constable instead of Samuel Smith.  
Feb. 17 1769: George Smith is appointed Constable instead of Phillip Varble.

July 18 1759: Deed from Esq. Henry McCulloch to George Smith, a planter, for

Book 18 page 295: On May 3 1802, George Smith, a planter of Rowan--no wife signs--lets Daniel Smith (also of Rowan) have 150 acres on north fork of Crane Creek, for \_\_\_\_\_, witnessed by & proved by Maxwell Chambers in May 1802. (Adam Kern & wife Catharine let George Smith have this on May 5 1795). (1793 is acknowledged.)

(May 9 1793: Deed from Conrad Kern & wife to Adam Kern for 150 acres May 8  
 Aug 5 1795: Deed from Adam Kern & wife to George Smith for 150 acres May 25 1795 acknowledged.)

Feb. 11 1791: "David Butner of the road leading thro. the Island above Yarborough Ferry on the Yadkin from George Smiths to the Middle of said River" & Gasper Smith from middle of island above said ferry, to Thomas Carsons--oversee

Book 9 page 647: On Aug. 27 1784, Alexander Long & wife Susanna of Salisbury, let George Smith, a planter, have 133 acres on both sides of the great road from Salisbury to Trading Ford on the Yadkin River next John Adams, Alexr. Long, Conrod Kern, Matt Troy & ---Craig, for \_\_\_\_\_ witnessed by Max Chambers & R.Hays. (Alexr Long got it on April 8 1783)

Feb. 11 1792: "Andw. Brown from George Smiths to the Middle of Yarboroughs Island" is appointed overseer of the road, & "Peter Brown from the Town Land to Geo. Smiths" also appointed overseer.

Book 13 page 827: On Nov. 18 1786, George Smith & wife Elizabeth of Anson Co. N.C., let Joseph Higdon of Rowan have 150 acres on waters of No Creek next said Smith's original survey & between Richard Peck & said Higdon for 50 pounds, witnessed by Richd. Peck & Richd. Smith & proved by Richd. Peck in Nov. 1794.

Nov 7 1794: Deed from George Smith & wife to Joseph Higdon for 150 acres Nov. 18 1786 proved by Richard Peck.

Deed from George Smith to Richard Peck for 100 acres ---18 1786 proved by Joseph Higdon.

"Administration on the Estate of William Barness (?) deceased is Ordered to issue to Peter Smith who gave Bond with Fredrick Smith Security, and qualified according to Law" Feb.9 1787. On same day: " John Lopp Col. Thomas Carson 1st: Major and Fredrick Smith 2d Major took the Oath of Allegiance prescribed by Law, in open Court"

Feb.1787 "Leonard Swink from Linster's Road to Longs Ferry With the Hands, below said Road to the River, between 2d Creek and Grants Creek" is appointed overseer on Feb.10 1787.

Aug.7 1787 The will of David Smith proved by John Billingsley & Ludewick Winkler. The widow, Barbara Smith, & Leonard Smith are Exrs.

The will of Jacob Trees (book G page 181) made Oct.30 1810 probated  
Son: John. Daughter Magdalen. Grandson Henry Swink (under age).  
Children: Catherine, Peter, Henry, Daniel, Jacob, Elizabeth, George & John. Exrs: Peter & Henry Doland. Witness: John Linn.

Peter Smith Sr. & wife Barbara who got land 1759

The will of Peter Smith (book A page 150) made Sept. 19 1767 proved --- Sick. Wife  
Children: George, Peter, John, Margret, Mary, Susanna, Elizabeth, Magdalen & Eve Knatzer. Grandchildren: John, George, Peter, Barbara Adams (children of the deceased John Adams). A legacy to Eve the wife of Christopher Knatzer if he dies before grandchildren become of age. The costs of a suit to be paid should Margaret Befle sue Peter. Exrs: James Carson & sons: George Smith & Richard Walton. Witnesses: James Carson, Rachel Hampton, Mary & John Dunn.

Book 4 page 679: Jan. 19 1762, George Smith--no wife signs--lets John Adams (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 229 acres on both sides north fork of Crane Creek next George Smith & Conrod Michael, for 5 shillings--the release price being 5 pounds on the next day--witnessed by John Lewis Beard & Daniel Little & proved in April 1762 by the latter.

Deed from Thomas & Michael Troy to Richd. Walton for 200 acres Nov. 25 1793 proved by Maxwell Chambers.

Feb. 14 1814: The will of Richard Walton proved by Jacob Smith & John Swink. John Walton qualifies as Exr. (see the settlement on Feb. 19 1814).

Division of Estates; book A page 22: On March 21 1814, David Woodson surveyed 1/2 of 111 acres according to the will of deceased Richard Walton, for his sons John & Peter Walton which is on both sides of Crane Creek next John, Peter & Benjamin Walton & Frailey's old line; also 119 acres for the heirs of the deceased Daniel Walton. (Isaac, Catharine, Joseph & Margaret Walton) which is next Stone John Walton, Benjamin Walton & a fork of the creek (this had been surveyed on April 24 1805 but David Woodson resurveyed it on March 21 1814).

Book 8 page 259: On Feb. 7 1775, George Smith & Richard Walton (as Exrs. of the deceased Peter Smith, farmer,) let James Hendricks have 235 acres on middle fork of Crane Creek next Hermon Hardman, James Carson, the dividing line between John Mitchell and the said Peter Smith (who let John Mitchell have 235 acres of the original survey), for 300 pounds, witnessed by Samuel Miller & John Dunn in Feb. term of 1775. James Hendricks paid the deceased Peter Smith himself for it, and Peter was granted the land by the Earl of Granville on Aug. 23 1759.

Book 4 page 305: On Aug. 23 1759, Earl Granville lets Peter Smith have 584 acres on both sides of North & Middle Fork of Crane Creek on west side of the Atkin River next Hardman Hartman, James Carson, Conrod Michael, Thomas Basford, Jacob Aaron & John Galche?, for

Smiths.

The Pathfinder of Aug(r).1927, says that it is estimated that there are about 1,300,000 persons named Smith in the United States--roughly one out of every hundred. The name is Anglo-Saxon & originally meant one who smites--such as goldsmith, blacksmith &c.

Smith Co. Tenn.

The Annals of Tennessee (by J.G.M.Ramsey, A.M.,M.D.,) page 706: Oct. 26 1799, "The county of Sumner was reduced to its constitutional limits, and a new county, by the name of Smith, established. Its first Court was held at the house of Major Tilman Dixon. Smith county was called for General Daniel Smith, who was a native of Virginia, and was appointed, by Governor Jefferson, a commissioner to run the dividing line between that State and North Carolina. In the execution of this duty, he saw the beautiful country in the west, and soon afterwards removed to what is now Sumner county, whose people he represented in the North-Carolina Legislature, and in the convention which ratified the Constitution of the United States. He became Secretary of the Territory and a member of the convention of 1796. He was afterwards elected one of the senators from Tennessee. General Smith was a practical surveyor of lands, whose works never needed correction. For intelligence, well-cultivated talents, for integrity and usefulness, in soundness of judgment, in the practice of virtue and in shunning vice, he was equalled by few; and in purity of motive, excelled by none.\* (The note=Blount Papers.)

Mrs. Sarah Humphreys Cutler Herlitz (wife of William Anders Herlitz), joined as #71650 from Ralph Humphreys. (Over). She is the daughter of Lord John Cutler & wife Kate Humphreys; granddaughter of John Colburn Humphreys & wife Sarah A.G. Stuart; great-granddaughter of David George Humphreys & wife Mary Colburn; great-great-granddaughter of George Wilson Humphreys & wife Sallie Smith (1776-1817) whom he married in 1792; great-great-great-granddaughter of Ralph Humphreys & wife Agnes Wilson whom he married in 1768.



A letter from Sally Humphreys (Mrs. S.L.Gwin) of Gwinhome, Greenwood, Miss. on March 9 1928, wondering why I had written Mrs. Bem Price of Oxford about her line who handed it to the State Regent, Mrs. Brown, who handed it to her, as I had helped her so much & already had the dope as referred to in Vol.72 page 309 #71873 from Col. Ralph Humphreys, Lieut.-Col. George Wilson, David Smith, Newell Walton & Wm. Marshall. She has the Mildred Maury record back to revocation of the Edict of Nantz (joinins Colonial Dames on it) & the Huguenots of Lannikin Towan. She is most anxious to complete the Marshall line as family tradition says she is of the same family as Chief Justice Marshall, but only has to William--she has some family relics to substantiate the claim and recalls that some members claim the relationship to the pirate, Blackbeard.

She also wants information of Edwin Hickman & son William of N.C.--Edwin was sheriff of Spottsylvania Co.Va. in 1739, William was a member of Committee of Safety in 1775. The latter was the father of Mildred Hickman who married William Smith & had Lucinda Smith who married James Hervey Maury & had Mildred Maury which is the line traced back to Edict of Nantes--also wants more about Mildred Miller Hall (1795-1835) who married William Marshall Hoakins in 1816--she has a pair of "Chemise Buttons" of hers & would like to honor her memory by a D.A.R. line from her father or grandfather.

Also wants to know why I ran her line to Newell Walton & stopped there--the family has convictions that he was a near relative of George Walton, the Signer, & has a tiny cabinet made by "Uncle George Walton" while he was working out his apprenticeship as a "joiner" or cabinet maker. Newell came from Lt. Sterling, Ky., to Miss.--do not know how he moved from Amelia Co.Va. nor his parent:

Betsy Ellington (1773-1855) married Thomas Hoskins(?) but while a cousin is accepted on this line, Mrs. Gwin's copy has been returned twice for corrections.

In grandfather Humphrey's autobiography, is much about the Revolutionary soldier, David Smith, who married Sara Terry, a daughter of Joseph Terry "Who fills a hero's grave on the bloody field of King's Mountain" but so far no documentary proofs of it. Major David Smith was a native of South Carolina & was descended of a Huguenot family of German extraction who fled to America after the revocation of the Edict of Nantes--he married Sara Terry, daughter of Col. Joseph Terry, & emigrated with his family to Mississippi, settling on Bayou Pierre in 1786. He later distinguished himself in the Creek War at Talladega, Emuckfaw & at New Orleans with Andrew Jackson, & was honored by the Legislature of Miss. which bestowed his name to the county Smith. Sara Terry Smith died & was buried at their family home, the "Hermitage" in Claiborne Co.Miss. & David then moved to Christian Co.Ky, where he again married a Miss Fort, by whom he had ten children. He died in Miss. was buried near Jackson in Hinds Co. He was the son of Daniel Smith (no further data as to wife, births & deaths, so this line was also returned as incomplete) who was commissioned Major of Washington Co.Va. Militia in 1777, served through 1778 with his regiment.

David Smith served as a private & Lieutenant in Militia & State line of N.C., he participated in the battle of King's Mountain, Siege of Augusta & served as a private in Gen. George Roger Clark's Ill. Regiment, in the Western Army. Documentary proof: Pension Claim W. File N.25006. Dec. 32 Journal House of Delegates Commonwealth of Va. 1783.

Trusting that above leads may be of help & that I may follow them up & write her. Her sister, Mrs. Steve Barnwell, lives in Gastonia.

His lands run up to the church & he says his spring is the one Frohock fell in after being shot by the Indians(?). He says his ancestor came from Germany bring built a brick house (burnt down) in midst of his many acres about five miles from this descendant's home (which he built) Henderson Crawford of Salisbury, N.C., related to above Lindsay Smith & to Senator Lee Overman, says it was his grandfather, Charles Smith who owned the brick house above mentioned, he also owned land on Sliver Creek and in Cotton Grove sections. He knows nothing, however, of any German connection, & thinks Mr. Lindsay Smith is mistaken.

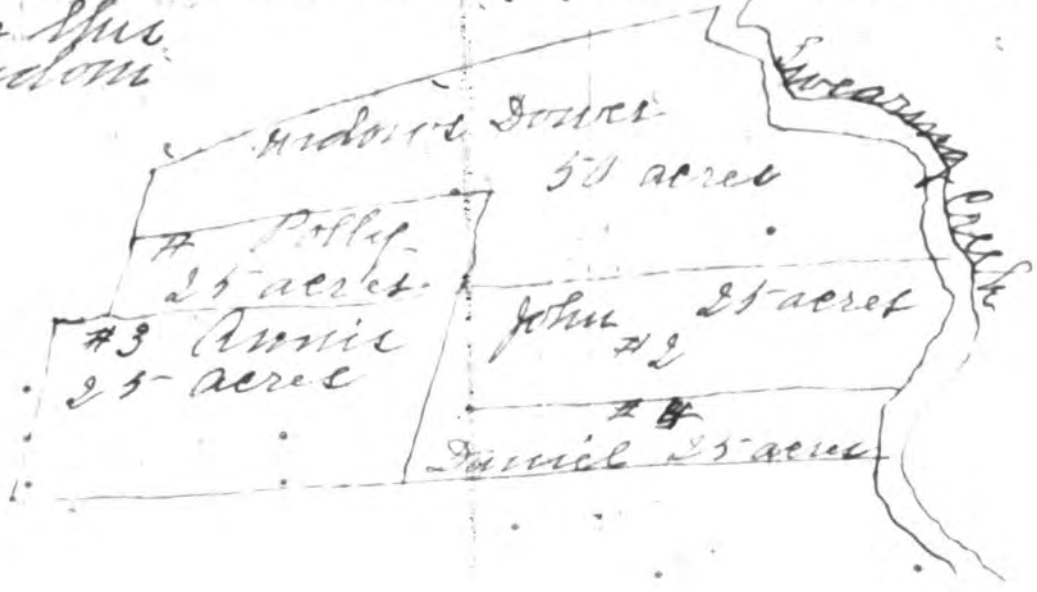

Book 18 page 561: March 24 1803, the heirs of Anderson McGuire (who are Philip Smith & wife Rachel, George Smith & wife Sarah, John Smith & wife Hannah, Theodory McKie & wife Elennor & Henry McGuire) let Major Casper Smith for his wife Nancy--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have their parts of the land <sup>on Potts Creek</sup> which came to them as heirs of above Anderson McGuire (who was a son of deceased Edmond McGuire who left it to him), for \$500.00, witnessed & proved by Morris Davis in May 1803. (See elsewhere for dimensions).

Book 18 page 901: Nov. 26 1803, William Strange (as administrator of the deceased Edward McGuire Jr.) lets Major Casper Smith ( ) have lot #4 in said estate, being 2 1/2 acres next the Trading Road for \$600.00, witnessed & proved by George Smith in Feb. 1804. (This is Edward McGuire's part of his father, Edward McGuire's estate, & also the 1/7 portion which had gone to the now deceased Anderson McGuire, who died without issue & was a brother of said Edward McGuire Jr.). It begins on the corner of lot #3, near the old Trading Road, at a stake, goes east with the original line 7 chains & 30 links to a stake (instead of a hickory in original), north with the original line 12 chains & 50 links to a stone, east with the original line again 35 chains to a post oak on the original corner, north 19 chains & 95 links to a stake on the corner of lot #1, west with the line of lot #1, 42 chains & 30 links to a stake on the corner of lots #1, 2 & 3, then south with the line of lot #3 to the beginning.

The will of Gasper Smith (Book H page 637) made Sept. 3 1834 & probated in Nov. 1834. Wife Nancy (1/3 of 204 acres where I live & her choice of two negroes). Sons: David (the land where he formerly lived but now occupied by William R. Holt providing he pay \$2500.00 to my executors to enable them to make the exchange), Johnny (304 acres where he lives if he pay \$600.00), Henry (160 acres where he lives if he pay \$600.00), Gasper (200 acres where he lives if he pay \$1000.00), Alfred (135 acres where he lives if he pay \$1000.00) & George (the eldest, 204 acres where I live with his mother & he may have crops etc, if he pay \$1200.00). Daughters: Rachael Hughes (wife of Richmond Hughes against whom I have a note of \$30.00, and to her heirs 1/8 when they are of age) & Sarah Roberts (1/8). Granddaughter Nancy Ribelin (a negro named Patience). Exrs: sons David & Gasper. Witnesses: Ebenezer Moore & J.L. Jeall. The date Dec. 24 1829 was erased.

Hargrave & William H. Slaughter & acknowledged on Oct. 5 1825.

Book 30 page 247: Nov. 7 1828, Fanny (wife of George Locke) lets Thomas Dews Jr. have much lands to pay the debts of her husband: 1200 acres on Yadkin River next Jesse Hargrave & Jacob Miller; some on Poplar Draft being her home-place which came to her from her deceased father, Spruce Macay, Esq. & a tract of 1000 acres in Gibson Co. Tenn. next Bleunt & Coon on Deer River

Book 32 page 81: May 25 1829, Casper Smith Sr.--no wife signs--of Rowan Co. N.C., lets William R. Holt of Davidson Co. N.C., have 184  $\frac{94}{100}$  acres on the waters of Potts Creek next James Smith, Mrs. E. Kelly, Anderson Ellis & the said William R. Holt, beginning at a small persimmon on the corner of William R. Holt (formerly William McGuire's), & going south  $2\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 19 chains & 85 links to a stone on the corner of William R. Holt, north with his line 85 degrees east 30 chains & 50 links to a stone on his corner, south with his line  $2\frac{1}{2}$  degrees, --- 12 chs. to a stone on his corner & the fence, north with his line  $87\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east passing his & the corner of James Smith at 8 chains to the corners of lots #3 & 4 at  $11\frac{1}{2}$  chains--in all 20 chains to a stone on the corner of James Smith at a fence, north with his line  $2\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west  $12\frac{1}{2}$  chains to a stone on his corner, north with his line  $87\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 34 chains & 75 links to a post oak on the corner of Mrs. E. Ellis, north with her line  $2\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 19 chains to a dogwood on the corner of W.R. Holt, south with his line 87 degrees west 42 chains & 50 links to a stone on the corner of the said Casper Smith & the line of said Holt, south with the line of the said Wm. R. Holt  $87\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 41 chains & 75 links to the beginning, for \$700.00, witnessed by Jno. McRorie & Henry R. Dusenberry & proved by the latter April 4 1833, before Judge Thomas Settle.

Book 3 page 409: Nov. 7 1755, Earl Granville lets Ambrose Joshua Smith have 640 acres on both sides upper fork of Pole Catt Creek, for 10 shillings, witnessed by John Haywood & Richard Williams & proved by the latter in Oct. 23 1756.

Oct. 21 1756: Deed from Esquires Francis Corbin & Benjamin Wheatley to Ambrose Joshua Smith for 640 acres "was Proved in open Court by the affirmation of Richard Williams". Same day: Deed of sale from Ambrose Joshua Smith to Peter Dicks for 640 acres is acknowledged.

Book 3 page 411: On Dec. 2 1755, Ambrose Joshua Smith lets Peter Dicks (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have the above 640 acres for 43 pounds Va. money, witnessed by Charles Saxon & Kitt Smith & acknowledged on Oct. 23 1756.

July 8 1766: Deed from Peter Dick & Elizabeth Dick to John Bals for 195 acres Oct. 24 1765 proved by William Hamilton.

Book 6 page 272: Oct. 24 1765, Peter Dicks & wife Elizabeth let John Beals & wife Sarah have 195 acres on south fork of Polecat Creek next that which had been owned by the late John Stone, out of "Natural Love and Affection which they hath and beareth unto sd John Beals and Sarah his wife" who are son-in-law & daughter of said Peter Dicks & wife Elizabeth, witnessed by Wm. Hamilton & Christopher Nation. (It was once owned by the now deceased Joshua Ambrose Smith who let said Peter Dicks have it Dec. 2 1755).

Book 5 page 263 & 264: May 20 1763, Peter Dicks, a planter & wife Elizabeth let Mathew Ozborn & Isaac Beason the "Overseers and in Trust for Center Meeting As it is Called" on south fork of Polecat Creek next where Peter Dix lives in St. Luke's Parish, have 3 1/2 acres for 20 shillings, witnessed by Josep Ozbun & John Beals & proved in July 1763. (This is part of the 640 acres which Earl Granville let Joshua Ambrose Smith have "by Indenture dated the 1st. Day of the 9th. Month called Sepr. 1755, and was afterwards conveyed by the sd. Joshua Ambrose Smith to the sd. Peter Dicks by Indenture dated the sec<sup>d</sup> Day of the 12th. Month called December 1755".

April. 21 1762: "A Deed of Feofmt" from Peter Dix & wife Elizabeth to John Stone for 250 acres April 17 1762 proved by Esq. Christopher Nation.

Southern Quakers & Slavery (by Stephen Weeks) page 106: Peter, Nathan & Zacharias Dicks came to New Garden, N.C. from Warrington Monthly meeting in Pennsylvania, while John Beals came from Hopewell Va. Page 109: "Thomas Scattergood, while visiting this meeting in 1792 was told by Peter Dicks" that when he moved to this place about 40 years ago (1755) from Warrington, M.M., there were but four or five families settled near him. They first held their meetings in a private house & later built a small meeting-house (still standing & used for a school)--near this is the present large meeting house recently built, and a large settlement of friends.

Jan. 22 1761: Deed of sale from Earl Granville to Ambrose Joshua Smith of Rowan Co.N.C., for 302 acres July 20 1758 is proved.

Book 4 page 357: July 20 1758, Earl Granville lets Ambrose Joshua Smith of Rowan Co.N.C., have 302 acres on branches of Pole Cat Creek next said Smith, Peter Dix & --- Gallinger, for 10 shillings, witnessed by Richard Vigers & Robert Caller & proved in Jan. 1761. (On the margin is marked delivered to W.Coletrain.

Book 4 page 405: Aug. 20 1760, Christopher Smith of Orange Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets William Coltrain of Rowan Co.N.C., have 302 acres next said Smith, Peter Dix & --- Gallinger, for 5 shillings--the release price being 26 pounds on the next day--witnessed by Christopher Nation & Benjamin Beason & proved in April 1761. (Earl Granville conveyed this to the now deceased Joshua Ambrose Smith on July 20 1758)

Book 4 page 684: Dec. 25 1762, William Coltrain & wife Rachel let John Beals Jr. have 302 acres on Polecat Creek next --- Smith, Peter Dix & --- Fothergill, for 26 pounds, witnessed by Michael Swaim & Esq. Christopher Nation who proved in

(Christopher or Kitt Smith let them have Aug. 21 1760)

Book 4 page 685: April 17 1762, Peter Dix & wife Elizabeth let John Stone--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 250 acres on the south fork of Polecat Creek, for 30 pounds, witnessed by Chrs. Nation & Michael Swaim & proved in April 1762. (This is part of 640 acres which Ambrose Joshua Smith let said Dix have Dec. 2 1755--see book 3 page 411).
