Book 65 page 122: Dec.11 1885, E.C.McLaughlin & wife S.Laura of Spartanburg, S.C., & Marietta L.Burns of Kershaw Co.S.C., Lucilla E.Miller & Sarah C.Miller of Rowan Co.N.C., let J.F. & Minnie E.Russell of Rowan Co.N.C., have 71 acres next ---Corriher (formerly ----Adam's) on the east bank of creek next ---Shulenberger, for \$710.00, witnessed by J.Manis, George W.Nichols, J.D.Dunlap, T.H.Clarke & W.A.Houck

Buried in heart of Concord, N.C.: Alexander F. Russell who died July 16 1853 aged 65 years, 8 months & 18 days; his wife Jane, died July 18 1850, aged 56 yrs. 4 mos. & 18 days; Laura, (daughter of A. & J. Russell) died Dec. 4 1824 aged 10 yrs. 8 mos. & 13 days. I am told there are 17 graves in this plot behind Hartley but not many stones remain--one being that of Louisa W. (daughter of A. & E. Suther--pronounced Suder) who died July 30 1817 aged 2 yrs. & 21 days.

Book 44 page 280: April 16 1869, William H. Russell & wife Catherine apply for a home-
stead, being allowed \$1,000.00 in real estate & \$500.00 in personal estate, may keep 172
acres where they live, valued at \$5.00 the acre, a house & lot in Salisbury where they
live, etc.

Book 2 page 252: Dec. 5 in the 29th year of Geo. II. William Mebane (Mary makes her mark) lets the planter--all? of Rowan Co.N.C.-- have all the divided seat or tract of 600 acres, beginning on the corner of James Russel on the north side of Buffalow Creek at a red oak, going north 240 poles to two white oaks & a hickory, west 400 poles to a red oak, south 240 poles to a white oak & a hickory, then east to the beginning, for 12 pounds Va., money, witnessed by Benjamin Starret & Edward Cox & acknowledged in Jan. Court of 1758.
Jan. 20 1758: Deed of Sale from William Mabane & wife to Abraham Bird for 600 acres Dec. 5 1756, is acknowledged.

Book 1 page 149: Dec. 27 1753, Henry Beddenfield, a planter of Rowan Co.N.C.-- no wife signs-- lets the weaver, William Mebane of Orange Co.N.C., have 600 acres on the north side of Buffelow Creek next James Russell, for 35 pounds Va. money, witnessed by Alexr. Mebane & John Thompson & acknowledged on Dec. 3 1753.

Cabarrus Co., N.C., book 3 page 295; Jan. 2, 1800, Samuel Linny Erwin--no wife signed--let Robert Erwin, (both of Cabarrus Co., N.C.), have 142½ acres beginning on the bank of Rocky or Johnstons River & going north 4 degrees east 160 poles to a stake, north 86 degrees east 199 poles to a red oak on the line of Robert Walker by Coddle Creek & the line now of Robert Walker (now the line of James Russell), south with his line 56 degrees east 40 poles to a hickory, south 25 degrees west 314 poles to a red oak on the river bank, then up its meanders to the beginning, for \$200.00, witnessed by Robert Rebb & John Russel & acknowledged on ---- (This seems to be a part of 280 acres granted by Gov. Dobbs as #5 to Samuel Rooker ex Erwin Sr., on June 25, 1764).

Book 11 page 165: Oct.25 1786, The State grants (#1170 at 50 shillings the 100 acres)
to George Russel 193 acres on the north bank of Cabbin Creek next Honour Serratt & up
said Creek.

Aug.14 1813: Deed from Nathan Russell to John Aderton for 40 acres Jan.2 1808 is proved by
Christopher Stokes.

Book 22 page 752 or 852 (numbered twice); Jan.2 1808, Nathan Russell--no wife signs--
lets John Aderton (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 40 acres on Cabbin Creek, for \$20.00,
witnessed by George Goss & Christopher Stokes & proved by the latter in Aug. 1813.

(This is some of the land which the said Russell sold George Goss).

Aug. 8 1777: " Ordered That two base born Children a Male and Female in possession of William Russel be brought to next Court by John Luckey Constable in Captain Armstrong's district there to be dealt with According to Law".
Nov. 7 1777: John Luckie is appointed Collector of the Tax in Captain William Armstrong's district.

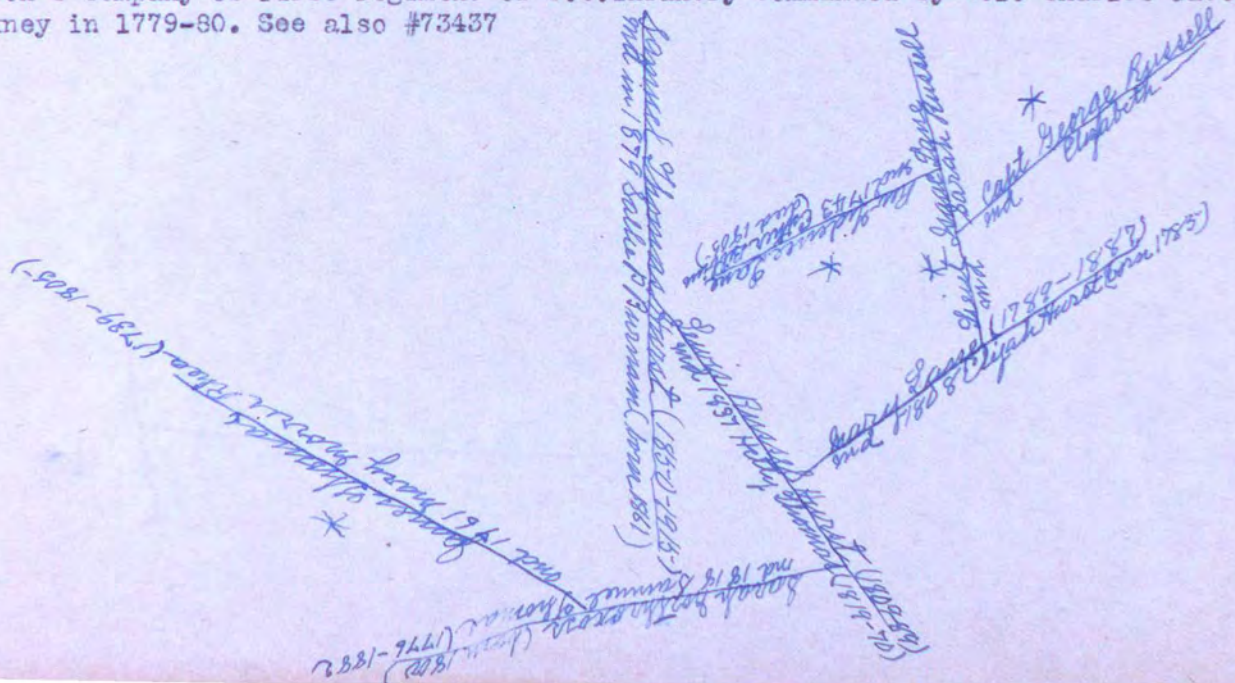

Colonel William Russell

Elizabeth's Dower in a certain Tract or parcel of Land in this County called the big Lick and containing by Patent three hundred and thirty acres, therefore William Edmondson, Aaron Lewis, James Dysart, Alexander Outlaw and James Thompson are appointed by the Court to lay off the Dower of the said Elizabeth wife to the said William Russell having regard to quantity and quality, particularly attending to the Salt Lick and this Court reserves to themselves the right of altering the same in future if it shall appear to the Courts satisfaction that the division of the ground where Salt water is found should be unjust and that the Surveyor or one of his Deputies attend the said Commissioners for the above purpose."

March 21 1783;

Page 1136: "Ordered that William Christian and Arthur Campbell Esquires be Guardians for Charles Henry Campbell and Sarah Buchanan Campbell, Orphan Children of General William Campbell according to Law and the Tenor of the said General William Campbell's Will they first giving Bond and Security".

Page 1137: "Arthur Campbell appointed Guardian to the Orphans of Gen. William Campbell by a former order that the Court gave into and acknowledged his Bond with Richard Poston and Joseph Black his securities the sum of ten thousand Pounds for the faithful Guardianship of the said Orphans and their Estates."

June 18 1782;

Page 1103: "On Motion of Col. William Russell in behalf of himself and the Executrix of the Estate of the late General William Campbell it is Ordered that William Edmondson, James Dysart, Aaron Lewis, James Thompson and Alexander Outlaw Gentlemen set apart and report the Dower of the Relict of the late General William Campbell and make return to Court as soon as the business can be Complied with." Page 1112: This order was recorded on Aug. 23, 1782.

April 17, 1782:

Page 1098: The will of William Campbell was proved by Wm. Edmondson, David Carson & James Dryden. Elizabeth Campbell qualified as exx. but Wm. Christian & Arthur Campbell resigned.

General William Russell

At a Court held in Washington Co. Va. Annals of Southwest Virginia page 1160
Aug. 20 1783; "The report of William Edmondson, Aaron Lewis, James Dysart, Alexander
Cutlaw and James Thompson concerning the rights of Dower of the relict of the late General
William Campbell who intermarried with General William Russell which is ordered to be
Recorded. Ordered that Colonel William Russell who intermarried with Mrs. Elizabeth
Campbell be summoned to appear at December Court next to render an account of the Estate
of the late General William Campbell."

Book 23 page 303: Nov. 4 1811, David Rineheart--no wife signs--lets John Thompson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on the north bank of Cabbins Creek next Michael Smith, William Ward & William Riley & down the creek, for \$250.00, witnessed by George Thompson & Andrew Thompson & proved by the latter in Feb. 1815. (George Russel let said Rineheart have this on Nov. 22 1803)

Book 24 page 784: Jan. 2 1808, Nathan Russell--no wife signs--lets George Goss (both of) have 260 acres on Cabbin Creek next James Morgan, Timothy Parks & Christopher Stokes, for \$300.00, witnessed by John Adderton & Christopher Stokes & proved by the latter in Aug. 1818.
