Book 40 page 308; Aug. 8 1854, Sidney E. Woods (an heir of deceased William Woods) with Jacob Sloop, as administrators of deceased William Woods; on a judgement against the Sidney E. Woods, James M. Woods & Neil S. Brawley, for \$289.49, let the Clerk & Master of Equity,

Book 40 page 457; May 11 1855, Luke Blackmer, Esq. as Clerk & Master of Equity, on a petition in the fall term of court 1853 from Allison F. Woods, J.N. Woods, Sidney E. Woods, Richard L. Woods, Richard Davis & wife Delila, John J. Patterson & wife Adalaid, Jacob Sloop & wife Polly T. of full age, & James H. Atwell, an infant by his next of friend for a sale, & it was sold on the premises Dec. 26 1853, to Richard L. Book 42 page 88; Aug. 8 1859, Ezekiel McKnight, Gaston Braly & Eleonor Braly of Marshal Co. Tenn. (by their attorney John McKnight), let David K. Woods of Rowan Co. N.C., have their undivided 2/3 interest in the estate of deceased Truth Woods, next John Leazer & Miram Smith, for \$50.00, witnessed by James Jameson & J. S. Hart & proved by the latter on Sept. 10 1858.

William Woods, Revolutionary Soldier

May 10 1851 Court Minutes; "On this the 9th. day of May 1851, personally appeared in Open Court; Alexander W. Brandon, who being duly Sworn according to Law, makes the following Statement; that he is now Sixty years of age; that he was well acquainted with William Woods in the lifetime of said Woods; that he frequently heard him Speak of his Service in the war of Revolution; of his having been in the battles fought by General Graniers, South Carolina, toward the Close of the war, particularly of his having been in the battle of Eutaw Springs; that the said William Woods, was universally Reputed to have been a Soldier in the Revolutionary War by persons Contemporary with that period; that he has frequently heard persons who were acknowledged to have been Officers & Soldiers in the Revolution, Speak of the Service of the said Woods; that Said Woods lived in the County of Rowan at the time of his first Acquaintance with him, but removed to the County of Iredell and Resided in Iredell at the time of his death.

(Head waters of Sills Creek)

Book 9 page 54; July 1 1779, The State grants (#1 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to William Arthurs 200 acres on the head waters of Sills Creek, beginning on the line of John Braly & the corner of David Woods at a white oak, going north with the line of Woods 1 degree & 30 chains, west 26 chains to a pine on his corner, north 88 degrees east 57 chains to a pine on his corner, the same course 77 chs. to the line of William Braly, then west with his line 77 chains to the beginning.

Book 43 page 225; Aug. 18 1866, T. S. Wood makes a deed of trust to D. B. Wood (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) for 300 acres called the Thomas Burke land; also 40 acres which he inherited from Col. James H. Wood, 4 horses, 4 heads of cattle & c, as he owes D. B. Wood \$1500.00, W. A. Wood \$500.00, Luke Blackmer \$500.00 in Confederate money, Robert Knox \$100.00 Elizabeth Knox \$200.00, William F. Hall \$120.00, the estate of Umphrey Nichols \$30.00, the estate of Col. Charles F. Fisher \$100.00, the estate of Adam Trexler \$80.00, Betsy Baker \$100.00, Joseph Barber \$100.00 & many others

Book 33 page 175; Sept. 27, 1836, Oliver Woods--no wife signed--let Joseph Atwell (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), and Daniel R. Bradford of Cabarrus Co., N.C., have 272 acres beginning on the south side of "great John Walker's corner on Hugh Parkes line at a black oak & going with the line of Walker 100 poles to a black oak on the corner of the said Walker, north with his line 1 degree east 180 --- to a black oak on the corner of Philip Careker, north with his line 46 degrees east 154 poles to a pine on the corner of Jehn Shive, south with his & the line of ---McRee 89 degrees east 144 poles to a post oak, south 1 degree west 80 poles to a black oak on the south side of the great road, then south 32 degrees west 242 poles to the beginning, for \$335.00, witnessed by James A. Atwell & Leck Atwell & proved by the last named in Nev. court of 1836.

Woods (Sills & Coddle Creeks)

Book 34 page 384; Feb. 4 1836, Samuel Sloan (as the attorney of Abner Hope & wife Jane of Cape Girardeau Co. Missouri,) lets John Leazer of Rowan Co. N.C., have 163 5/10 acres next George Masters, ---Crosby, Truth Woods & ---Atwell; also 3 acres "Called Joshua's Meadow" next Truth Woods, up & crossing the creek, edge of a bottom & crossing a branch--in all 163 5/10 acres--for \$245.00, witnessed by J.T. Alexander & James Sloan & proved by the latter in May 1840.

Feb. 4 1801; Administration on the estate of deceased David Woods, on the relinquishment of the widow, issued to Hugh Braly & Abram Woods, who gave bond of 1000 pounds with Aaron Varas as security.

Joshua B. Wood (Mt. Ulla & Atwell Township)

Notes on the Atwell Family (owned by Mr. Obey Atwell of Salisbury, N.C.): Lock Atwell born 1784 died 1844; his wife, Mary Smith, born 1786 died 1862. Lock Atwell came from Ireland to Grayson Co. Va., thence to what is now Atwell Township, Rowan Co. N.C. & married Mary Smith. Richard Smith is the soldier whose widow drew a pension.

% Book 65 page 94: Jan. 20 1885, Obadiah W. Atwell & wife Margaret let S.A.D. Hart--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 71 acres about 17 miles west of Salisbury in Mt. Ulla & Atwell Township next Samuel McLaughlin, Mrs. Terrence, William B. McCorkle & Mrs. Neel, for \$1550.00, acknowledged on Jan. 20 1885. (This is the western part of Joshua B. Wood's plantation).

Joshua Woods (Ridge between Sills Creek & head waters of Coddle Cr

Book 19 page 318; Nov. 2 1805, Edison Foster--no wife signs--lets Joshua Woods (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 100 acres on the ridge between the waters of Sills Creek & Coddle Creek, including the heads of two branches of Coddle Creek, beginning on the line of George Masters & the corner of Joshua Woods at a post oak, going east with the line of said Masters & William Braly 77 chains to a post oak on the line of said Braly & the corner of William Thompson, north $1\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west 13 chains & 25 links to a post oak saplin, west 77 chains to a new line on or near the line of Woods, then south with the variations, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Aaron Vorhis & Hu Braly & proved by the latter in Nov. court of 1805. (this is what John Wasson Sr. let the said Edison Foster have).

Book 18 page 17; May 6 1800, John Wason Sr.--no wife signs--lets Edison Foster (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 100 acres on the head waters of Gills Creek, beginning on the south side of a tract of land, beginning on the line of Hugh Braly at a post oak, going east 77 chains with his & the line of William Braly to a post oak on the line of William Braly & corner of William Thompson, north $1\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west 13 chains & 25 links to a post oak saplin, west 77 chains to a division line to David Wood's line at a corner pine, then south with the variations to the beginning, for 50 pounds, witnessed by David McCannless & Samuel Wason & proved by the latter in Feb. court of 1801. May 1802 (minutes page 166): "William Crosby appointed Guardian of Elizabeth Crosby, by Alexander Crosby & Garner Crosby, his own Children to account for their estate descending from their Grand father David Wood, gave bond with John & Samuel McGlaughlin each bond 100".

Book 32 page 444; March 16 1835, Alexander Crosby--no wife signs--lets James Jameson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 23 acres on Blythes Creek next James Jameson, Truth Woods & John Leazer, for \$30.00, witnessed by Jas.F.Jameson & Truth Woods & proved by the latter in Aug. 1835. (This is said Crosby's share as an heir of deceased David Woods, being half of the undivided tract)

Book 24 page 1; Feb.20 1817, Daniel Wood--no wife signs--lets Daniel Warner (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 160 acres on the north bank of the Yadkin River next Joshua Wood, William Wood & Mc Crump, for \$600.00, witnessed by William F.Anderson & William B.Wood, & proved by the latter in Feb. 1817. *This begins on the corner of what was formerly Joshua Wood's but now William Wood's at a black gum out from the river & along the line of William Wood about 190 poles to the corner of her wood. South 65 degrees east a straight line to a black oak on the line of Mc Crump. 70 degrees east 36 poles to a dogwood on the line of James Kent 130 poles to a walnut on the river bank, then up its various courses to the beginning*

Nov.1846: The will of Elizabeth B.Woods is proved by James Jemison (who is acquainted with the handwriting of deceased John Barkley). Truth Woods is executor.

Sons of the American Revolution, page 276: John Speed Smith of Washington, D.C., joined the District of Columbia society as #13568, son of Curran Cassins Smith by Salkie (Woodloe); grandson of John Speed Smith by Eliza (Clay) & of William Clinton Woodloe by Almira (Dursley); great-grandson of William Smith by Mary (Speed) & of William Woodloe by Susannah (Woods) & of William Dursley by Elizabeth (Bill); great-great-grandson of James Speed, Lieutenant of Cook's Virginia Militia, Archibald Woods, Captain of the Virginia Militia & pensioned, & of Samuel Bill, Captain of the Virginia Line.

Book 11 page 857; May 18 1789, The State grants (#1910 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Christian Livingood 209 acres on the waters of Swearing Creek, beginning on the corner of his deeded land at a post oak & going east 12 chains to a stake, north 1 chain & 50 links to a post oak on the corner of John Randleman, west with his line 50 chains to a stake on the corner of Charles Slagle, south 54 chains & 50 links to a chestnut, east 38 chains to a black Jack, then north with the line of his deeded land to the beginning.

N.C.--no wife signs--lets Hugh Brookshire of ----, have 209 acres on the waters of Swearing Creek next John Randleman & Charles Slagle, for 60 pounds, witnessed by Jesse Brookshire & Edward Hughes & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1792.

Book 64 page 488; Feb. 28 1885, J.B. Woods of Iredell Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets T.D. Roseman also of Iredell have said Woods' interest of ---- in what is known as the D.K. Woods Tract" next John Leazer, William Smith, James Carrier & others, for \$1000.00, witnessed by W.R. Smith & R.P. Roseman & proved by the latter on March 6 1885.

Vinson Wood (Swearing Creek)

Book 11 page 336; Aug. 9 1787. The State grants (#1488 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Hugh Cunningham 200 acres on Swearing Creek next John Reese? *It begins on the line of John Reese at a red oak & goes south with his line 48 chains to a post oak, east 48 chains & 70 links to a white oak, north 48 chains to a red oak, then west to the beginning.*

Book 13 page 388; March 22 1792. Richmond Pearson--no wife signs--lets Vinson Wood (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 200 acres on Swearing Creek next John Reese, for 90 pounds, witnessed by James Macay & Avention Reed & acknowledged in Nov. 1793. (The State granted this to Hugh Cunningham who let the said Pearson have it).

Rudolph Yonse (Waters of Swearing Creek)

Book 11 page 356; Oct. 25 1786. The State grants (#1446 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Rudolph Yonse 150 acres on the waters of Swearing Creek, beginning on the corner of John Goonse & the line of Jacob Waggoner at a post oak, going with the line of said Goonse north 31 chains & 75 links to a white oak on the corner of Christian Livingood, west with the line of said Livingood 47 chains & 30 links to a pine, south 31 chains & 75 links to a pine, then east to the beginning.

Daughters of the American Revolution, Vol. 77 page 252; Mrs. William Herndon Guitar (Sallie Cheetwood Pierce), joined as #76667 from the services of Colonel James Woods (1748-1822), of Virginia, was Colonel of a Regiment of Foot in the Virginia Troops in 1776. He was born in Albemarl Co., Va., & died in Garrard Co., Ky., See #68188.

She is the daughter of Hiram Cheetwood Pierce (1838-1870) who married in 1868, Elizabeth Harris (1849-1891); granddaughter of James Harris (1919-1881) who married in 1848, Sabia Brown Jackson (1829-1903); great-granddaughter of Overton Harris (1789-1844) who married in 1814, Mary Rice Woods (1795-1876); great-great-granddaughter of James Woods who married in 1779, Mary Garland (1760-1835).

Book 18 page 1024; May 27 1806, Joseph Clarke--no wife signs--lets John Buis Jr. (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have the above for \$1250.00, witnessed by James Camplin & John Felps, & acknowledged in Nov. 1807. (This had been granted Avention Reed on May 18 1789).

Book 13 page 809; Oct. 11 1794, Henry Roberts, a blacksmith (Massie Roberts makes her mark), lets William Wood--all of Rowan Co.N.C.-- have 150 acres on the waters of Holmans Creek, beginning on the corner of Jacob Gobble at a stake & going south 57 chains & 5 links to a stake, east 11 chains & 5 links to a stake, north 63 chs. to a post oak on the corner of Jared Wood, east with his line 20 chains to a stake on the corner of John Dancy, north with his line 14 chains & 5 links to a post oak, west 47 chains & 50 links to a stake on the line of Gobble, south 20 chains to a hickory grub, then east to the beginning, for 50 pounds specie, witnessed by John Gobble & John Bailey & proved by the latter in Nov. court of 1794. (The State sold this on Dec. 20 1790 to the said Henry Roberts & it is part of said 350 acres).

Joshua & Jane Woods (Waters of Sills Creek & Coddle Creek)

Book 24 page 109; Feb. 19 1817, Esq. Alexander Frohock (as High Sheriff of Rowan Co.N.C., on executions against the estate of Joshua Woods for \$91.17 recovered by Thomas L. Cowan as administrator of William Moore, Andrew Kerr & John B. 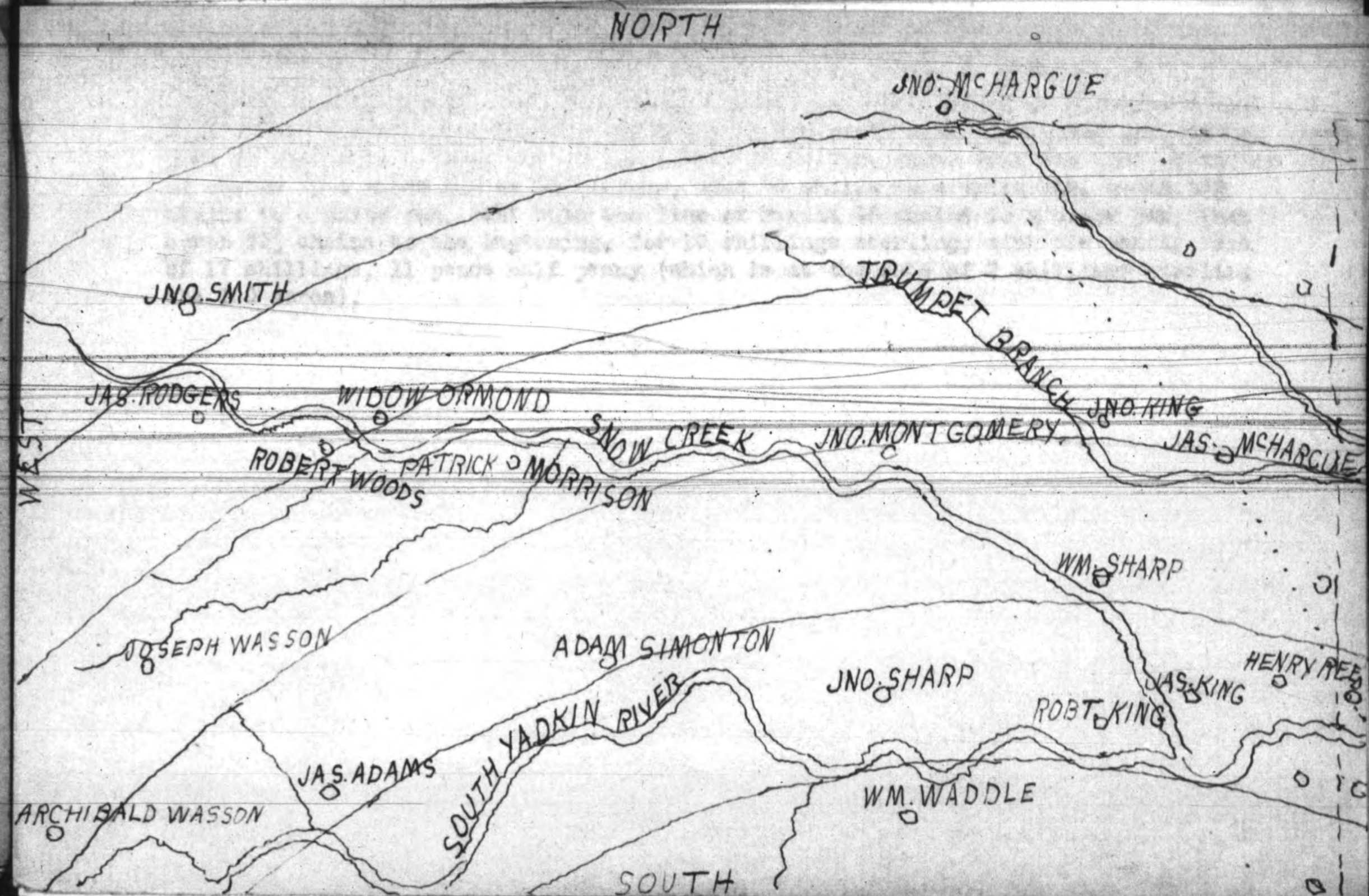

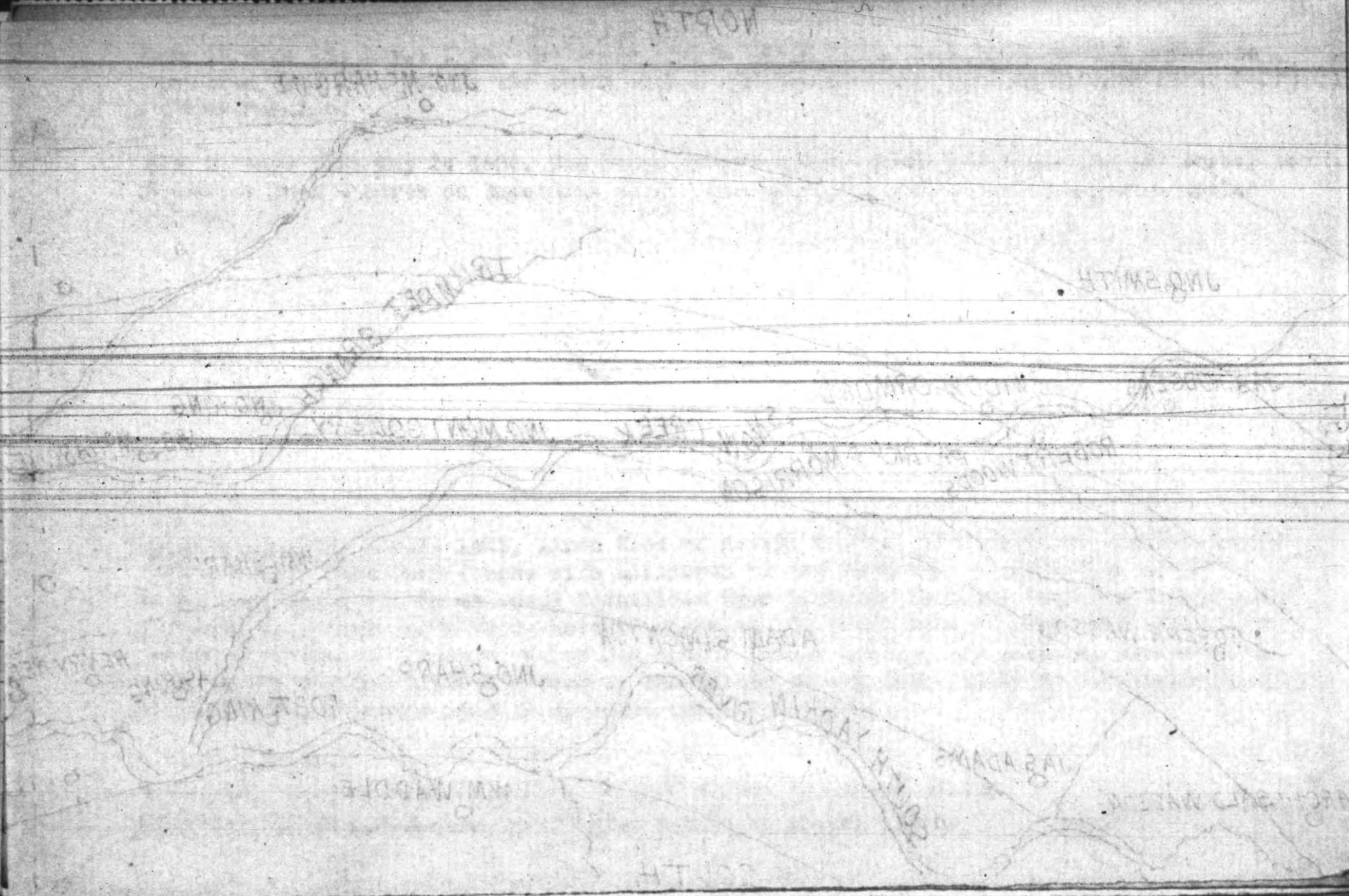
