This pamphlet is prepared to aid in carrying out the spirit and intent of that resolution, and in compliance with another special action that was taken at the 1918 meeting of the association. It contains the names of the children, grand-children and greatgrand-children of John Michael Winecoff. Its special object is to enlist the aid of all who are interested in tracing out all the rest of the descendents of John Michael Winecoff, to the last generation, whether now living or not, that their names may be included in a book that may be published later; and that none may be omitted, an appeal is hereby made specially to those whose names appear herein, and all others whom they can enlist, to furnish names, by writing to the undersigned, stating first whethor now living or dead; 2nd., who were the parents, if possible the grand-parents, 3rd., whom each married; 4th, the children of each, whether now living, or dead, to the last generation, so that each one may be placed in the right line of descent. It is also requested that any mistakes that may be found herein will be pointed out.

In about the year 1750, it appears that one Michael Winecoff (German, Weinkauff) came to America from Germany, with his wife and one child, and settled on the land that is now known as the Godfrey Winecoff place, near Concord, N. C., So far as has been learned, their only child was John Michael, who was only goven years old at the time of their coming to this country, the

date of his birth being in the year 1743. John Michael Winecoff married Barbara Ann (possibly, Mock); and from them have sprung all the Winecoff's and all other people of Winecoff blood in America.

From John Michael and Barbara Ann Winecoff have descended 8 children; 60 grand-children, 222 great-grandchildren; and between 2,000 and 3,000 belonging to later generations. Of the grand-children, only one is now living, Oct. 1918, viz: Miss Mary Winecoff, who is still at the old John Michael Winecoff homestead. But many of the great-grand children, whose names are printed herein, are still living, and here are some 2,000 or more, belonging to the 5th, 6th, and 7th generations to be reckoned. For the sake of convenience, John Michael Winecoff is taken as the 1st generation, his children as the second, etc.

The children were Daniel, whose children were five in number and grandchildren 9; Mathias, children 6, grand-children 40; David, children 5, grand-children 22; Michael (2nd. gen.) children 14, grand-children 73; Godfrey, children 10, grand-children 20; Ann, children 7, grandchildren 27; Mary, children 5, grand-children 7; and Barbara, children 8, grand-children 24.



# Local Historian Adds To Story Of Winecoff Claim To Corban St.

# Old Deeds Filed at Courthouse Shed Light on Historic Argument

Miss Eugenia W. Lore, local historian, takes issue with a statement appering in the Tribune of June 9 concerning a claim of the Winecoff family that their ancestors gave the land from which Corban street came into being. Miss Lore has this to say con-

cerning the early history of the town of Concord: My dear Mr. Sherrill:

Your article in Sunday's Tribune (June 9, 1946) concerning the claim of the Winecoff family that their ancestors gave the land from which Corban street came into be-

ing needs clarification and correc-Quoting from the manuscript history of Cabarrus county which was written by the late R. W. Allison (1809-1898) — a copy of which I have in my possession -"It was said that the land on which the town was located was a gift, but that is a mistake, for there is a deed from Samuel Huie to John Means, James Scott and Leonard Barbrick, Commissioners to superintendent the Public Buildings in Concord, appointed by the Justices of the County Court for that purpose, and for and in consideration of the sum of twentyfive pounds in hands paid, conveyed to said commissioners, and their successors in office, in trust for the County of Cabarrus, a piece or parcel of land lying on the waters of the Three Mile Branch, a subdivision for his land, etc., dated February 4, 1796." Register of Deeds Office, Book 2,

page 60. "The tract of land contained 26 acres — a rectangular plot — 80 poles by 52 poles. The deed was registered at the April sessions, Pleas and Quarter, Cabarrus Co.,

"In the original layout of the town, provision was made for two streets — Union and Corban — to intersect at the square upon which the first courthouse was built. These streets made four plots, plots of ground which were divided into lots and sold at public sale. Each plot contained eleven

lots, each of which was approxi-

mately one-half acre. "In Book 2, pages 92-94, Regiser of Deeds office, Cabarrus county, you will find the deed for the lots which Michael Winekauf bought, dated April 18, 1796. One lot, No. 7, was in the extreme southwestern part of the original tract purchased from Samuel Huie and the other lot, No. 8, joined it on the north, These lots would now be facing South Spring street near the alley that runs by the home of Ephraim Tucker. The toal amount of land purchased by Michael Winekauf was approximately 1 acre. These deeds were the only deeds made by the commissioners to Michael Winekauf.

"The total number of lots in the four squares was 44, the acreage amounting to 22 acres, the streets absorbing the remaining 4

"Mr. Winecoff was also in error as to the origin of Means street. This street was widened and improved when the late W. G. Means was mayor and named in his honor about 1890."
