

Aug. 1801 (page 120): The land of deceased Arthur Smith deceased is divided among the wife & 8 children (5 white & 3 Blacks)

It seems that Arthur Smith made a deed to prevent the widow from getting her rightful amount.

Nov. 1801 (page 141): Arthur Smith's widow gets 1/6 of the land

May 16 1815: Administration on the estate of deceased Susan Smith is granted to Arthur Smith who gave bond of 800 pounds with Barzel Gaither & William Bailey as security.

Book 21 page 90: Nov. 2 1804, Isaac Smith--no wife signs--lets James Pelley (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 89 3/4 acres on the bank of a branch next Smith, for \$300.00, witnessed by Thomas Oakes & Daniel Orrell & proved by the latter in Aug. 1807.

Book 21 page 91: Nov. 2 1805, Jacob Smith--no wife signs--lets Jilson Berryman (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 110 acres where said Smith formerly lived, for \$442.00, witnessed by Thomas Oakes & James Pelley & proved by the latter in Aug. 1807.

Book 21 page 70: Sept. 15 1806, Hardy Jones--no wife signs--lets Samuel Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 30 acres next where James Baxter now lives, Benjamin Berriman & Peter Dowel, for \$100.00, witnessed by Thomas Watkins & Levi Smith & proved by the latter in May 1807.

Book 23 page 353: March 5 1815, Benjamin Berryman--no wife signs--lets James Beeding (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 20 acres next said biton, Peter Dowell & Hardy Jones, for \$60.00, witnessed by J. Berryman & Samuel Jones & acknowledged in May 1815.

Division of Estates, book A page 52: By order of Aug. court 1809, the lands of deceased Arthur Smith are divided by the commissioners (John Ellis, James Ellis, Evan Ellis, Mr. Phillips & B. Riddle, surveyed on Sept. 28 1809 by John Little Jr., D.S., with Benjamin Riddle & James Ellis as C.B.)

Tract is 434.05 acres on Linvilles Creek.

Lot #1 of 128.0.24 acres on the creek bank goes to Sally Smith.

" #2 " 152 1/2 " next Sally Smith " " Drew Smith.

" #3 " 154 " " Drew Smith " " Arthur Smith.

" #4 " 181.3.28 " " Robert Johnson & James Ellis, & Evan Ellis

goes to David Smith, while Richard gets 86.3.24 next James Ellis, Evan Ellis & Robert Clark--these are parts of land which the deceased Arthur Smith got from John Johnson.

Lot #5 is on Elijahs Creek being 231.acres & 19 rods.

Book 27 page 657: On Oct. 17 1817, Ezekiel, James & Mary Phillips let Samuel Smith (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 195 1/2 acres on waters of Jacob Black's Mill-Creek, for \$130.00, witnessed by Frederick Miller, William & James Etcheson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1823. (This is part of a State Grant of 300 acres to Jeremiah Malone on Nov. 4 1784--see book 10 page 523--who let Ezekiel Philips have it on Feb. 5 1787, who died & it fell to his only heir-at-law). This is on the line of Edward Sylva, next Samuel Smith & James Etcheson.

May 8 1795: Deed from Jacob Stallings(?) to John Brindle for 122 acres on April 1 1795 proved by John Eccles.

Book 22 page 224: On Feb. 12 1809, George Brindle of Surry Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Frederick Barnicastle of Rowan Co.N.C., have 100 acres next Jesse Marshal,--- Daniels & Yarbour, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Henry Cretpheser & Willie Ellis & proved by the latter in Aug. 1811. (This is part of 450 acres granted Jacob Shallings by The State).

May 17 1836: "Administration on the Estate of Richard Smith dec'd. granted to Pleasant barnycastle--he gave bond with Isham P.Ellis, John Lunn, Elijah Smallwood, William Jarvis, and Thomas Gray in \$1200 and was qualified and obtained letters"

Aug. 1836 (3d Monday): "Account sales of Estate of Richard Smith, dec'd. filed"

Book 24 page 766: On Oct. 15 1817, Richard Smith--no wife signs--lets John Cheshier Jr. (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 200 acres on north fork of Elishas Creek in forks of Yadkin River for \$450.00, witnessed by Arthur Smith & Evan Ellis & proved by the latter in Aug. 1818.

Book 24 page 730: On Nov. 12 1816, Jesse Marshal of Rutherford Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets William Brindle of Rowan Co.N.C., have 122 acres on Yadkin River next John Brindle & A.Brindle, for \$195.00, witnessed by Adam Little & Abram Brindle & proved by the latter in Aug. 1818.

Book 26 page 374: On May 5 1819, Arthur & Drury Smith--no wives sign--let Nathan Chaffin Jr. (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 126 acres & 16 poles on Linvilles Creek next said Chaffin & his mill-pond, for \$400.00, witnessed by W.W.Chaffin & Thomas Oakes & proved by the latter in May 1821

Book 26 page 412: On Jan. 14 1817, Thomas Job of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Nathan Chaffin of Surry Co.N.C., have 19 acres & 16 poles next said Job on the waters of the Yadkin River, for \$60.00, witnessed by Samuel Smith & Thomas Oakes & proved by the latter in May 1821.

Book 22 page 561: On Dec. 24 1811, Adam Little, John BarneaCastle & wife Catherine (heirs of deceased Abraham Little) let Margaret Little (widow of deceased Abraham Little) have 90 acres on Bryans Mill-creek next Thomas Oaks & Abraham Little, for 90 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Hilton & Pleasant Chaffin & proved by the latter in Aug. 1812. (This is part of 300 acres granted by The State to John Johnstone on Oct. 10 1783--see book 9 page 572--who let Abraham Little have it on Sept. 2 1790--see book 12 page 486).

Book 12 page 486: On Sept. 2 1790, John Johnston & wife Elizabeth, let Abraham Little (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 300 acres on Bryans Mill-creek next Isaac Adams, Samuel Job & the conditional line between said Johnston & Jacob Little, for 125 pounds, witnessed by Evan & John Ellis & proved by the latter in Nov. 1791.

Book 14 page 578: May 7 1795, Frederic Black & Sarah Black let Israel Watkins & Andrew Tucker (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 137 1/2 acres on Bryans Mill Creek, for 82 pounds, witnessed by Arthur Smith & George Black & proved by Jacob Black in Aug. 1796.

Book 14 page 585: On April 21 1796, Israel Watkins & wife Mary & Andrew Tucker & wife Levisa let Samuel Smith (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have the above tract for 90 pounds, witnessed by George Gentle & John Smith & proved by the latter in Aug. 1796.

Book 17 page 460: Nov. 14 1799, Michael Shaw & wife Mary let Samuel Smith all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 36 acres on Samuel Bryans Mill creek next Isaac Adams & --- Malon, with free access to the spring & schoolhouse, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Watkins & William Smith & proved by the latter in Nov. 1800.

Book 28 page 641: --- -- 182-- Isaac Call & wife Elizabeth of Wilks Co.N.C. let Fielding Slater of Rowan Co.N.C., have their undivided 1/7 part of the tract on Bryan's Mill Creek next Joseph Locker, David Enochs on the north side of Mill Creek next Josh Johnson, being 250 acres, for \$40.00, acknowledged by them at Wilkesborough on March 16 1826, before J.J.Daniel J.S.L.E.

May 5 1791: Deed from John Johnston to Arthur Smith for 340 acres Feb.26 1791 proved by John Johnston,
Book 12 page 311: Feb.21? 1791, John Johnston of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Arthur Smith of Halifax Co.N.C., have 340 acres on Linvilles Creek next John Linville, William Linville & Samuel Bryant, for 340 pounds, witnessed by John Drew, A. Brown & John Johnston & proved by the last named in May 1791.

May 5 1791: Deed from John Johnston to Arthur Smith for 300 acres Feb. 26 1791 proved by Jno. Johnston.

Nov. 10 1793: Deed from Arthur Smith to Lewis Brewer & wife for 69 acres on Sept.16 1793 proved by Abednego McAtee. (See elsewhere).

Book 18 page 177: On Oct. 25 1801, Abednigo McAtee--no wife signs--lets Evan Ellis & Stephen Beauchamp--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 44 1/4 acres on Ellis Creek next said McAtee's 100 acres, Thomas Job & William Hutchyson, for 10 pounds, witnessed by Wm. Moore & Thomas Job & proved by the latter in Nov. 1801. (This is part of a State Grant to Jacob Little who let Abednego McAtee have it).

Book 14 page 282: Dec. 7 1795, Joseph Wolfscale of Madasin Co. Kentucky--no wife signs--lets William Etcheson of Rowan Co.N.C., have 220 acres on Ellis creek, for 200 pounds, witnessed by David Spricks & Robert Ross & proved by the latter in Feb. 1795.

Book 12 page 17: On April 27 1790, Thomas Job & wife Hannah let Abraham Little (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 100 acres on Ellis Creek next Evan Ellis Joseph Wolfscale & David Hendrix, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Benjamin Hinkle(?) & Abraham Hendrix & proved by Benjamin Hendrix in May 1790.

Book 14 page 185-6: Oct. 7 1791, Esq. Robert Weakley of Davidson Co. in the territory south of the Ohio--no wife signs--lets Abraham Little of Rowan Co.N.C., have 155 acres on Bryants Mill Creek next John Johnston, Isaac Adams & Adam Black, for 77 pounds, witnessed by James Duncan & Henry Rutherford & proved by the latter in Nov. 1795. (This had been granted by The State on Nov. 9 1784 & is #906).

Book 27 page 753 or 799 (numbered twice): July 20 1819, John Jinks--no wife signs--lets James Wedington (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 73 1/2 acres on Sugar Tree Creek next Isaac Ellis, --- Smith, --- Ellis & William Lunn, for \$225.00, witnessed by Wm. James & Wm. Coker & proved by the latter in May 1824

Book 24 page 407: On Nov. 13 1811, Mary James & John Ellis Jr., let John Jinks (all of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 73 1/2 acres on Shugar Tree Creek next --- Ellis, Arthur Smith, Robert Johnston, James James & Isaac Rich, for \$200.00, witnessed by William Eycheson & John Ellis, & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818. (This is two separate but adjoining tracts: one of 67 acres which James Brewer let George James have on March 30 1802 see book 19 page 812, & one of 6 1/2 acres which William Brewer let George James have on Jan. 12 1807).

Book 26 page 833: On Nov. 26 1821, John Williams--no wife signs--lets Thomas Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 50 1/4 acres on Bryan's Mill-creek next (what had belonged to Jacob & Elijah Adams), John Miller & Benjamin Adams, for \$150.00, witnessed by John Eastburn, William James & William Atcheson & proved by the last named in Feb. 1812. (This is part of 106 acres which Isaac Adams let Jacob Adams have on Feb. 17 1810--refer to book 23 page).

Book 27 page 785 or 830 (numbered twice): July 2 1822, William Coker--no wife signs--lets James C. Weddington (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 33 1/2 acres on Cub Creek next said Weddington & the original line of Robert Johnston, (being part of the 49 acres Archibald Johnston let Isaac Harris have), for \$80.50, witnessed by George Colhen(?) & Richard Deaven(?), & acknowledged in May 1824.

Book 12 page 325: Feb. 26 1791, John Johnston of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Arthur Smith of Halifax Co.N.C., have 300 acres on Cub Creek next Robert Johnston, Evan Ellis & John Allen, for 300 pounds, witnessed by John Drew, A? Brown & John Johnston & proved by the last named in May 1791.

: Deed from John Johnston to Arthur Smith for 300 acres Feb. 26 1791 is proved by Jno. Johnston.

Nov. 23 1836: "Ordered by the Court that Evan Ellis the guardian of Arthur Smith's children, be and is hereby authorized to receive from Pleasant Barnacastle all estate belonging to his Wards, it appearing that Ellis has been regularly appointed Guardian of said minors in the State of Indiana, Wayne County".

Book 18 page 408: On Oct. 25 1801, James Beauchamp of Shelby Co. Kentucky--no wife signs--lets Abednigo McAtee of Rowan Co.N.C., have 40 acres on Elis's Creek next Stephen Beauchamp, for 10 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Job & Wm. Moore & proved by the latter in Aug. 1802. (This is on the original line of a tract of land which Earl Granville let William Linville have on Jan. 1 1761, he died & his heir-at-law, William Linville Jr., let Samuel Baily have it, who let the heirs of John Beauchamp--Catharine, James, John & Stephen Beauchamp--have it on Nov. 10 1787, & the will of John Beauchamp

Mocksville, Davie Co.N.C., book 1 page 71: The will of Edmund Etcherson made Dec. 16 1843. Sons: Duckett (the homeplace), Daniel, James & Shadrack. Daughters: Lyda Beeding & Polly Smith. Others mentioned: William Allen, Joshua Baxter & Charles Dailey. Exr: son Shadrack. Witnesses: Frs. A. Ward, Thomas Smith & John Bornycastle. (Davie Co. cut off Rowan Co. in 1836).

Book 18 page 969: On Feb. 4 1804, William Brewer--no wife signs--lets Robert Clarke (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 69 acres on the dividing ridge between Sugar tree Creek & Cub Creek next Evan Ellis & Robert Johnston, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Benjamin Guy & John B. Palmer & proved by the latter in Feb. 1803. (This is part of a gift from Arthur Smith to Lewis Brewer during their lives & they let William Brewer have it for the same time and these are now dead).

Book 26 page 258: On Oct. 17 1817, Robert Clark--no wife signs--lets Arthur Smith (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 69 acres on Sugar Tree Creek next Evan Ellis & Robert Johnston, for 40 pounds, witnessed by Thomas Hilton & Michael Haines & proved by latter in Feb. 1821. (This had been formerly given by Arthur Smith Sr., now deceased, to Lewis Brewer & wife Elenor who let William Brewer have it on Sept. 2 1797--see book 16 page 87--and he let said Robert Clark have it).

book 11 page 75: John Tate, a planter--no wife signs--lets Robert Steele (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 301 1/2 acres on north bank of Third Creek including the great road from Salisbury & where it crosses the shoals of said creek, next Able Armstrong, Samuel Steele. John Robley, Joseph Wilson & said Tate, for 100 pounds, witnessed by James McBroom, James Steel & Samuel Young & proved by the last named in Aug. 1787. (This is part of 640 acres which Earl Granville granted the deceased Robert Tate on Jan. 7 1755 & he left it to the said John Tate in his will which was dated April 3 1776).

Book 20 page 586: May 21 1816, Reubin Hill & wife Sarah, Betsy, Samuel, William & Susanna Rice let Philip Rice--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 196 acres on Third & Fourth Creeks, which would fall to them out of the dower of deceased Frances (widow of deceased Isam Rice) next Samuel Culbertson--formerly Henry William's--William Gray & James Marlin--see deed from James Marlin to the deceased Isom Rice--in which the said Betsy had got & exchanged land with her deceased brother, Francis Rice so has two shares, the said Susanna had got the share of her sister Sally (wife of William Smith), witnessed by John Andrews, Nancy Brandon & J. Gay proven by the latter in Nov. 1816 & by Francis Neely on May 21 1816.

Book 32 page 450: Aug. 4 1835, Silas Rice--no wife signs--lets William Burke (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 133 acres on the north side of Third Creek next Henry Burke, Silas Rice Tate, ---McEllerwrath, --- Burke, on division line between Francis Rice & Sally Hill next Reuben Hill on the edge of the creek or mill-pond, passing --- Young (now Henry Burke's), for \$550.00, witnessed by Philip Rice & R.N. Flemming & proved by the latter in Aug. 1835.

book 23 page 204: Dec. 30 1809, Francis Rice lets Reubin Hill (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 20 acres on north side of Third Creek next the mill of John Howard, on the bank of mill-pond next Robert Tate, for \$80.00, witnessed & proved by Seth Hill in Aug. 1814. (This is part of the tract which Robert Tate let the heirs of Isham Rice have)

Book 24 page 422: On June 24 1809, Robert Johnston (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 143 1/2 acres on Cub Creek next Archibald Johnston & Henry Railsback, for 140 pounds, witnessed by John Ellis & Henry Railsback & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818.

Book 13 page 376: On Sept. 16 1793, Arthur Smith--no wife signs--gives out of affection for Lewis Brewer & wife Elenor, 79 acres next Evan Ellis & Robert Johnston, witnessed by William Brewer & Abedenego maccetee & proved by the latter in Nov. 1793.

Nov. 10 1793: Deed from Arthur Smith to Lewis Brewer & wife for 69? acres on Sept. 16 1793 proved by Abednego McAtee.

Book 19 page 878: On Dec. 6 1800, Thomas Brewer Jr.-- no wife signs--lets Joshua Stinson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 40 acres on Cub Creek next --- Brother's field, for 50 pounds, witnessed by James Brewer & John Ellis & proved by the latter in Nov. 1805. (This is part of 132 1/2 acres which Archibald Johnston let Isaac Harris have)

30 Book 14 page 398-or 498: On Dec. 3 1795, Robert Johnston--no wife signs--lets Archibald Johnston (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 132 1/2 acres on Cub Creek next said Robert Johnston, for 50 pounds, witnessed by James Brewer & John Ellis & proved by the latter in May 1784.

3D Book 19 page 812: On March 13 1802, James Brewer--no wife signs--lets George James (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 67 acres on Dutchmans Creek next ---Ellis, Arthur Smith & Robert Johnston, for 67 pounds, witnessed by John Williamson & Joshua Stinson & proved by the latter in Nov. 1807.

Book 17 page 724: On Jan. 20 1801, Isaac Harris--no wife signs--lets John Williams (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 70 acres on Ellis Creek & Sugartree Creek next Robert Johnston, said Harris & Thomas Brewer, for 65 pounds, witnessed by Joshuary Senior & Michael Shaw & acknowledged in May 1801.

Book 24 page 504: On Jan. 12 1817, William Brewer--no wife signs--lets Joshua Stinson (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 9 1/2 acres on Sugar Creek next James James & Robert Johnson, for 10 shillings, witnessed by William Deaver & John Eastburn Jr. & proved by the latter in Feb. 1818.

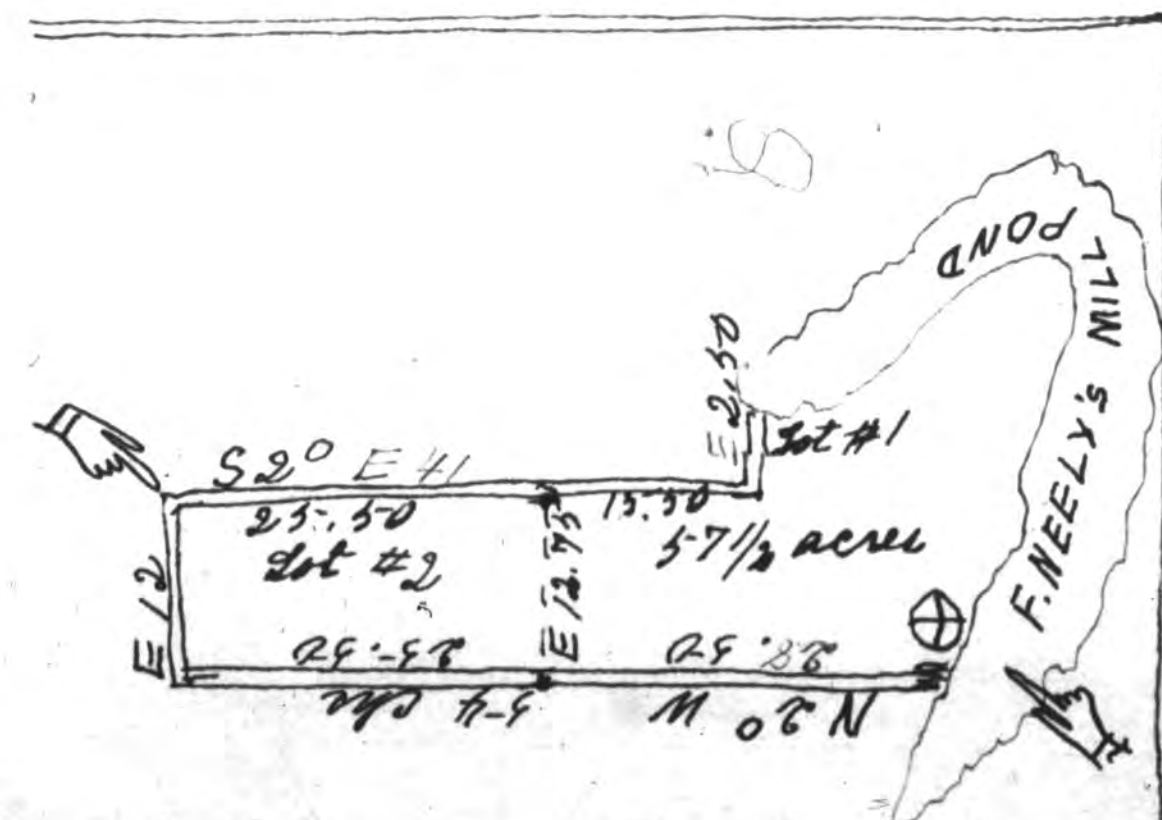
Book 22 page 42: Oct.2 1810, John Tate, a resident of Logan Co.Kentucky--no wife signs--lets the heirs of Joham? or Isham Rice deceased, have 452 acres on the north side of the mill-pond (which was formerly John Steele's but is now in the possession of Benjamin Howard) on Third Creek next John Young, & John Rosebrough, for \$904.00, witnessed by Jeremiah Robinson, Samuel Trott & William Gray & proved in Feb. 1811.

Aug.3 1803: Letters of administration on the estate of Isam Rice deceased granted to John Howard, Francis Neely & Philip Rice who gave bond of 700 pounds with William Willson & John Robley security. Next page: Esq. Francis Neely is to take with him John Culbertson, James Marlin, William Willson & Isaac Anderson, & lay out one year's provision for Fanny Rice out of this estate.

Feb. 1804: An account of the sales of deceased Isom Rice amounts to 473-6-5

Division of Estates book A page 157: A report in Feb. Court of the division of Isam Rice's estate which had been heired by Allen Rice & which is now divided again between William Smith (in right of his wife Sally) & Susanna Rice, being lot #1 as allotted to deceased Allen Rice of whom they are heirs as done Feb.13 1816 & proved by Wm.G.Crosby. Tract #1 of 52 1/2 acres on the north side of Francis Neely's mill-pond on Third Creek next John Rosebrough & Samuel Rice is allotted William & Sally Smith; & lot #2 of 31 1/2 acres & 28 acres of the Phillip Rice plantation which comes from the dower of their deceased grandmother, is allotted Susanna. Mrs. Mamie (Owen) Caldwell of Salisbury, N.C. (of the Maxwell Chambers' set) says Robert Varner Cowan married & had: George Hiram (killed a man named John Smith at Lyerly's store possibly ever a girl in self defense) served in Civil War, married Miss Watkins of Ohio, moved to Iredell County N.C. where he was a merchant; John Maxwell Cowan (married Florence the daughter of Henry Turner of Iredell Co. N.C.); Dr. Robert Locke Cowan (practiced for 40 years & is now 83 years old) married Mollie Smith of near Grace Church section (daughter of a slave owner & wealthy man); a baby (died early) & Mary Elizabeth Cowan who married Abner Washington Owen while studying in the Rankin Seminary (in the home of Miss Mamie Mock) where Owen was the youngest teacher. Abner W. Owen was practically a self-made man (his father dying when he was about 16 or 17 years of age, leaving a widow, Delilah, and a family of small children of whom he was the eldest). He studied at night, attended the farm and other jobs necessary in the home, as the money left the family had been dissipated by Julius Neely (who was either executor or administrator). Went to Olin Academy, and to Stephen Frontis & Prof. York (whose methods he used) in Salisbury. Was asked by Bank Davis to teach a number of boys & later managed to get the Peabody Fund & established the first public school in Salisbury (on the present site of Baptist Church) which building was burned, & was here assisted by his wife & daughter, Emma Owen. Still later this public school developed into the first graded school of Salisbury which was located behind the present site of the People's National Bank, where he was assisted by a quakeress of Winston-Salem, Miss Reynolds, & Prof. Welborn (who later went to Texas). Still later the Graded School built on its present site on Ellis St. Beside Abner Washington Owen, Delilah (Smith) Owen had: Frank (served in Civil War--his son Rowan Owen married Ellen Sides (who is now a widow living next Mr. Tommie Johnston on west Kerr St, Salisbury) but the homeplace is about six miles from Salisbury on the Statesville road where Chammie Owen may have a family history; Maxwell Owen also served in Civil War; Lieut. Julius Owen married a Miss Fitzgerald & moved to Lexington, N.C.; Giles Owen married 1st Laura Winders & 2 the sister of John Wise--another sister married into the family; Jane Owen married Milas Agner & lived about six miles from Salisbury on Statesville road where they reared a family; Margaret Carolina, married John Wise & moved to Statesville, N.C. & Mary Ann Owen who died young & unmarried. The mother of these, Delilah (Smith) Owen married again to Townsley who was a widower with two daughters who were Eliza (married a Graham) & Alice (married a Cranford).

Miss Mamie (Owen) Caldwell promises to let me copy her old Bible. She says she was related to the deceased King Edward of England & received a letter from him acknowledging the connection--the Owen family having come from Wales centuries back. She says her father had an uncle who preached forty years in another who was baptist minister, & the Maxwell Chambers home opposite Post Office where Printing office now is--refer to his will in Court house which will make these things plainer. He gave much to Presbyterian Church & to Davidson College. She thinks that Dr. Cowan of Ellis St. may tell more.

The will of Robert Cowan (book H page 594) made March 1 1830, having been afflicted with disease of body for some time past & prolated in May 1833. Messrs Cicero Rankin & William Reed Barker--both deceased druggists of Salisbury, N.C.) were related to Senator Lee Overman through their mother, who was Angelina Smith (called Angy) of Lexington, N.C. Their father William M. Barker (who was early left an orphan while living in Madison, Rockingham Co.N.C. but came to Rowan Co.N.C. as soon as his apprenticeship was over) lived with his cousins, the Bradfords of Bradfords Regulator (who later moved to Atlanta, Ga.?) but a rich couple by the name of Thompson had no children and adopted him in lieu of none of their own. Having been handed over to the rich Thompsons, he was apprenticed to his adopted father, who was a blacksmith. When twentyone he came to Rowan & fell in love with Angy (the only child of her parents of whom the father had died early, & the mother had left her other husband with whom she was very unhappy, before marrying Mr. Smith--she may have been a Dobson). Settling in Salisbury, Mr. Barker and Angelina had three children, the above druggists & a daughter that died when nine months old. After Angelina's death, Mr. Barker again married into the Smith family--this wife was a relative of his first wife and was named Annie. Annie was living in the home of Sandy Smith when married to Mr. Barker--she had a sister, Laura McCreery (a beautiful woman who was run over by the train while driving in her buggy taking her daughter, Lillie to see Mrs. Nannie Miller on one Saturday--the daughter was badly hurt but recovered and married when grown) & Nannie who married Mr. Miller--she probably lived near Trading Ford for that Mr. Barker had no children by his second marriage. He & both wives are buried in Oak Grove or the Old English Cemetery, Salisbury, N.C. The Smith relatives of his wives were mostly buried in Jersey Meeting House yard. Sandy Smith (with whom Annie Smith Barber was living at time of her marriage) had no children. He was a lovable man & his wife was very friendly with Alley (Alice Smith) Slater who was one of the best of women.

The land is about Swearing Creek, & there is a widow. Lot #1 goes to Polly consisting of 25 acres next John Kelly; lot #2 goes to John also 25 acres; lot #3 goes to Anne & consists of 25 acres next Lewis Beard & John Kelly; #4 goes to Daniel & is 25 acres (see elsewhere).

Book 14 page 489: On Jan. 30 1796, Barbarah Moires ("Spinster" also "Widow of Phillip Moirs") of Rowan Co. lets Gasper Smith, planter, have for 50 pounds 35 bushels of Indian corn, 12 bushels of wheat &c. for 10 years, 8 mos. & 3 days, a lease on some land left her by her deceased husband until his son, Jacob Moirs, is of age (which is at the expiration of 10 yrs. 3 mos. & 3 days) witnessed by two George Smiths in May term 1796. 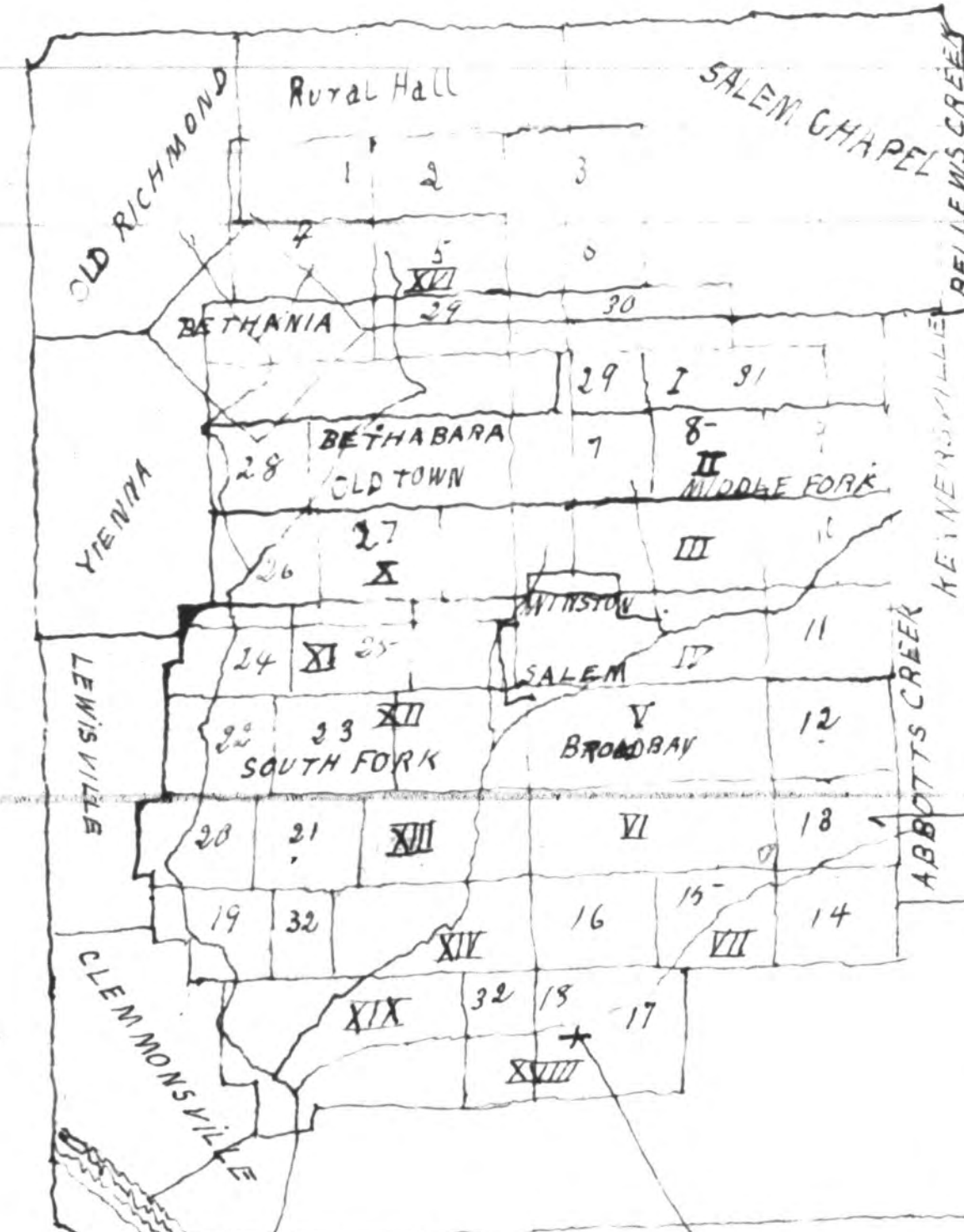

(This is part of the 498 acres granted said Andrew by The State on Oct. 10 1783).

book 10 page 147: Oct. 10 1783, The State grants (#528 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Andrew Ferguson 498 acres next Richard Robison, on the edge of a hill & down the creek, next Robert McJride, Andrew McClain, William Robison & Richard Robison.

Book 12 page 491: Sept. 10 1791, Jacob Hartman--no wife signs--lets John Buis (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 193 acres on both sides Spaughs Creek on lines of Stokes & Surry Counties, next Adam Spaugh Sr., on the dividing line of ---Hartman, Peter Schener, a ridge, George Smith & crossing said creek, for 145 pounds, witnessed by John Fry, Peter Fry & Henry Rippel & proved by the last named in Nov. 1790. (Earl Granville on May 10 1762 granted 492 acres to the planter George Hartman, who agreed to divide with Adam Spaugh Sr. which left 232 acres according to the map--see book 5 page 62. and a grant of 111 acres to Adam Spaugh on July 25 1787 next the above on the north side of the Wachovia line--see book 11 page 70--and as George Hartman willed that Gottlieb Schober of Salem in Stokes Co. N.C. be appointed executor in Nov. 1788, and the 262 pounds have been paid &c.--see book 11 page 669.

Book 11 page 388: April 11 1789, Jacob Hartman of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets George Smith, a blacksmith of Salem, Stokes Co. N.C., have 243 acres on both sides of Spaughs Creek which is in two separate tracts, for --- witnessed by Henry Fortney & Peter Seamer & proved by the latter in May 1789. (This was a State Grant on April 8 1789, which Gottlieb Schober as executor of the will of the late George Hartman & said Jacob confirm)

Book 11 page 669: April 8 1789, Gottlieb Schober, a gentleman of Stokes Co. N.C., lets Jacob Hartman a planter of Rowan Co. N.C. have (whereas on May 10 1762, Earl Granville let the now deceased George Hartman, planter of Rowan Co. N.C., have 491 acres on both sides of Spaughs Creek, & as said Hartman & Adam Spaugh Sr. agreed to divide leaving 132 acres of this to said deceased George--see book 5 page 62-- and also divided a Grant of July 1787 between them giving said deceased George 111 acres next the above land & on the north side of the Surry line or Wachovia line--see book 11 page 70-- and as said deceased appointed said Schober to sell the land for his said son Jacob Hartman to satisfy the creditors, & as the widow, Mary Hartman of said deceased, is willing & the bonds amount to 262 pounds, he delivers 243 acres to said son, witnessed by Henry Fortney & Peter Seamer & proved by the latter in May 1789.

N.C., have 150 acres on Muddy Creek, for \$195.00, witnessed by John Hage & Jacob Wesner & proved by the latter in May 1814. (This is a part of the State Grant of 1789.)
