Note (6) Mary Ann Thomason married Anthony Cozort ~~in~~ Nov. 24, 1831 and moved to Arkansas. My great-grandfather George Thomason went to Arkansas with John Thomason in the spring of 1849 and lived with Mrs. Cozort; only lived a month or two, and was a little past 71 years old.

Note (7) Jane Thomason, as well as I can figure it out, is the Mother of the Kincaid grandchildren mentioned in the will.

Book 58 page 464: April 6 1877, Calvin Harrison & wife Julia A. (with T. Cranford as the trustee of Jesse Thomason) let Joseph Mingus--all of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 7 acres next Mrs. Bailey, Mrs. Harrison & Mrs. Mingus near a branch, for \$105.00, witnessed by W.A. Houck & John E. Briggs & acknowledged on Feb. 3 1881.

Book 58 page 272: Dec. 16 1869; Jesse P. Thomason--no wife signs--lets Joseph Mingus (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 60 acres next J.H. Mingus, lots #2 & #3, for \$400.00, witnessed by Daniel Penninger & Wilson Trott & acknowledged on Dec. 11 1880.

Will book #1 page 28, &c: On Aug. 2 1869, S.S. Trott applies for the place of administrator of Thomas Todd's will, being the son of Nancy S. Thomason, a deceased legatee. He says Thomas Todd died on July 23 1869, and that one of the executors, Archibald H. Caldwell predeceased the maker, and the other one, D.A. Davis, renounces. Says the personal estate is worth about \$1,500.00, and the 500 acres are valued at \$4,000.00. One of the legatees, John B. Todd, is dead leaving children, Martha, Mary & Maria--all of full age. Nancy S. Thomason left S.S. Trott, David H., Benjamin, Captain Todd & Wilson---. Of these, S.S. & Wilson Trott live in Rowan Co. N.C., as does Mary Ann Gheen, who is a specific legatee, but Benjamin lives in Mississippi as does Captain Todd; David H. lives in Sumter, Alabama; Betsy Trott lives in Texas & Mary Kerr lives in Memphis, Tenn.

The will of Thomas Todd, made Jan. 16 1858, leaves property to: niece Mary Ann Gheen; brother John B. Todd; sisters: Nancy S. Thomason, Elizabeth P. Trott, & Mary Kerr. Should any of these try to break the will, the property then goes to the children of my half-brother, David Rutherford, who are: James, Thomas, William B. Rutherford & Mary Ann Gheen. Exrs: Archibald H. Caldwell & D.A. Davis. Witnesses: N.F. Hall & J.C. Gillispie. Some of the negroes are kept but money is provided for sending the others to free states of Liberia.

Buried at Thyatira, Rowan Co. N.C.: Thomas Todd, born Sept. 6 1772 died July 23 1869 age 75 yrs. 10 mos. & 17 days; Ann Thompson, died Oct. 17 1821 in her 61st year (the monument erected by her only son, Thomas Todd). This Thomas Todd may be the one who came from Concord Church--see Lingle's History.

Will of George Thomason*

In the name of God, amen, I, Richard Thomason, of the County of Rowan and State of North Carolina, being very weak and low in body, but in perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that gave me my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executor and nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form:

1. I give and bequeath unto my son George Thomason, 75 acres of land, including his improvements.

2. I give and bequeath unto my son Bias Thomason and my son William Thomason my dwelling house and plantation, to be equally divided between them.

3. I give and bequeath unto my son-in-law, William Julian and Fanny Julian his wife, one-third of my moveable property after all my just debts are paid.

4. I give and bequeath unto my granddaughter, Hannah Kincaid and my grandson, Thomas Kincaid, and my grandson James Kincaid and my granddaughter Ann Kincaid, these four grand-children to have the balance of moveable property equally divided among them.

I also ordain my well beloved son George Thomason and my beloved friend, Benjamin Howard, Esq., executors of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby disallow, revoke, disannul all and every other form, testament, will, bequeath and executors by me in any manner willed and bequeathed, ratifying and conforming this and no other to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 4th day of September in the year of our Lord 1824.
