Fleming: (IL or Fourth Creek).

Aug. 15 1770: Lease & release from Robert Allison to John Fleming for 309 acres Oct. 19 1769 proved by Christopher Erwyn.

Book 7 page 243: Oct. 19 1769, Robert Alison, a planter of South Carolina--no wife signs--lets John Fleming of Rowan Co.N.C., have 309 acres on both sides of IL Creek (a branch of Third Creek), for 5 shillings--the release price being 47 pounds & 10 shillings on the next day--witnessed by Christopher Erwin & William Erwin & proved in Aug. 1770. (Earl Granville let the Hon. Robert Simonton Esq. have this on May 7 1757, he & wife Margaret sold it to the Rev'd. John Allison on July 19 1767, he has died and it belongs to the said Robert Alison by inheritance?).

Book 2 page 149: July 19 1757, Esq. Robert Simonton & wife Margaret of Rowan Co.N.C. (as trustees of Rev'd. John Alison, a gentleman of the province of Pennsylvania) let said Rev'd. Alison have 309 acres on both sides of IL Creek (a branch of Third Creek), for 5 shillings--the release price being 10 shillings on the next day--witnessed by Hu Waddell & Thomas Alison & acknowledged on July 22 1757. (This had been sold to said Simonton for the use of said Alison, on May 7 1757).

Oct. 12 1764: Lease & release from John Flemming to William Mordough for 300 acres Aug. 28-29 1764 is proved by Wm. As ell.

Book 6 page 37: Aug. 29 1764, John Fleming, a planter--no wife signs lets William Mordah, also a planter have 300 acres on both sides IL branch waters of Third Creek, for 40 pounds (the release price being the same next day) witnessed by Wm. Archald & John Mordah & proved in Oct. 1764. (This was granted by Earl Granville on Jan. 9 1761 to John Fleming)

IL Creek (pronounced as it spelt Iel) is in Iredell Co.N.C. about five miles from Stateville over towards Unity.

Book 10 page 379: July 25 1785, William Killen, a surveyor of Lincoln Co. N.C., lets Henry Shoot of Rowan Co.N.C., have 178 acres on head waters of Hugh Parks Creek next William raly & John raly & his own survey, for 300 pounds, witnessed by Mitchel Fleming & Alison Fleming & proved by the latter in Fe. 1786.

Page 380: Another from same to same on same day for 300 acres in same locality next Robert Carlisle & Alexander Astan proved April 21 1786.

Book 18 page 135: Aug. 23 1801, The State grants (#2735 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Alison Fleming 31 acres on Coddle Creek next John Nicler (? said Fleming, Robert Cochran, Jacob Benning & John Parks. (This was entered on June 10 1794).

# Allison Fleming of Delaware & North Carolina

1950 Catawba Frontier 1775-1781 memories of Pensioners, (compiled & printed at 2339 Nebraska Ave, Washington, D.C., in 1950 by Mary Elmer Sapsenby), page 30: FLEMING, ALLISON 1779. Served in regiment of Col. Joseph Dickson, Captain Prisk, and was at Hershaw's Mill on Four Creek near what was called Pine Tree, now Camden. Tour lasted about three months.

Served in Rowan under Capt. James Higgins.

1780. Joined General Rutherford's army on the Catawba and was at the battle of Ramsour's Mill. From there to Salisbury and down the Yadkin and Pedee. At battle of Gum Swamp near Camden. General Gates' army was totally routed. With some other troops they assembled at Charlotte for the remainder of the three months for which they were drafted.

Besides these two tours, he served as a minute man i.e. soldiers bound themselves by promise to gather instantly when called upon by any of the officers on any military service that might be thought necessary or practicable for an uncertain time. These terms generally lasted a few days at a time, and he thinks his service as a minute man must have run about two months.

Witnesses to the application for a pension were John Carrigan and James Kerr. Allison Fleming was born in Delaware, April 6, 1759. He came to Rowan at the age of twelve and had resided there ever since.

Among the Revolutionary War Pensioners of Rowan Co. N.C. was Allison Fleming, age 75 years who got \$50.00 beginning March 4, 1891, for his service as a Private in the N.C. militia.
