"Joseph Abernathy, known as 'Uncle Joe' was the head of another branch of this Abernathy family. He too was born in Lincoln County, North Carolina. He was one of the very earliest in the Apple Creek Settlement. His farm was just west of the Church grounds, on the south side of the road to Pocahontas. With straight black hair, dark complexion, high cheek bones, and erect stature, 'Uncle Joe', according to the traditions coming down from early days, was part Indian—a descendant of the Virginia Princess, Pocahontas. The town of Pocahontas was named in honor of 'Uncle Joe' and in recognition of his tradition. Evidently he was a relative—the testamentary proof indicates he was a brother—of the celebrated Elizabeth Abernathy, who married the son of 'Gentleman' John Perkins, and who 'was said to be the handsomest woman of her day. She was tall and handsome, and her form and moving was graceful and elegant. her eyes were dark and sparkling, and her hair-as black as the raven's wing.
