Henry Pless (Cold Water Creek)

Book 34 page 74: July 13 1837, Jacob Correll--no wife signs--lets Henry Pless (both of Rowan Co.N.C.)have 50 acres on Cold Water Creek next Samuel Diel, east bank of Mill Creek, Daniel Beaver, near a spring, David Beaver, & crossing the head of Mill Creek, for \$1100.00 witnessed by Peter Ketchey & Martin Shive & proved by the latter in Feb. 1839.

Book 64 page 428: Dec. 17 1884, U.N.Pless & wife Mary C. let James M. Goodman--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 24 acres on the road next ---Beaver for \$240.00, acknowledged on the same day.

Book 64 page 430: Dec. 17 1884, U.N.Pless & wife Mary C. let James M. Goodman--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have (then it goes to Ida Arphia Goodman) out of complete courtesy, 31 acres next the schoolhouse, ---Davis " the Church, for \$300.00, acknowledged on the same day.

N.C.D.A.R. Register of 1947 page 36: Mrs. R. J. Singer. (Ann Neal Pless), as #362195, from the services of John Witherspoon, a Soldier of North Carolina joined the "Martha Belligrew Chapter," (organized Aug 30, 1946), of Marion, N.C.

J.H.Pless (Steele, Atwell Townships & Lincolnton road)

Book 87 page 552; March 27 1900, John C.Albright & wife Lillie J. let Michael A.Bas-singer & wife Mary E.--all of Rowan Co.N.C.--have 31 acres in Steele Township next --- Goodnight & ---Nixon; also 25 acres in Atwell Township on the Lincolnton road next -- Goodnight & ---McConnaughey, for \$680.00, witnessed by J.M.Yost, J.P., & acknowledged on the same day. (J.H.Pless & wife C.H? deeded this on Dec.22 1896).

Henry Pless (Dutch Buffelov Creek)

The will of Catharine Smith (book 11 page 273), made April 27, 1857 & probated in May 1859. She wants everything divided between her son Caleb Stirewalt & Sarah Pless. Executor: Caleb Stirewalt. Witnesses John P. Yost & Alfred Brackwelder.

Page 38 deed book 90: Jan 9 1847, Jacob Phillips--no wife signed--let Paul A. Seaford, (both of Rowan Co. N.C.), have 57½ acres near the head of Dutch Buffaloe Creek next lot #2 & Jacob Miller, for \$30.00, witnessed by Caleb Stirewalt & Henry Pless, & proved by the latter in May 1847. (This is lot #3 in the estate of deceased John Stirewalt, Jr.)

Book 34 page 59: Dec. 17 1836, Caleb Stirewalt --no wife signs--lets Henry Pless (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 68½ acres on Dutch Buffelov Creek next John Roseman, John Stirewalt & lot #2 in the division of deceased John Stirewalt Jr., for \$400.00, witnessed by John F. Stirewalt & Jacob Shaver & proved by the latter in Feb. 1839.

Henry Pleas (Dutch Buffalow Creek)

Book 32 page 510: Oct. 8 1835, John Duke & Solomon Duke--no wives sign--let Henry Pleas (all of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 165 acres on Dutch Buffalow Creek next the whole tract #1, a field for \$560.00, witnessed by A. Roseman & Charles Stewart & proved by the latter in Nov. 1835

Henry Pless (Dutch Buffelow Creek)

The will of Catharine Smith (book K page 273) made April 27, 1857 & probated in May 1859. She wants everything divided between her son Caleb Stirewalt & Sarah Pless. Executor: Caleb Stirewalt. Witnesses John P. Gost & Alfred Brackwelder.

Page 38 deed book 90: Jan 9 1847, Jacob Phillips - no wife signed - let Paul A. Seaford, (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), have 57½ acres near the head of Dutch Buffalo Creek next lot #2 & Jacob Miller, for \$30.00, witnessed by Caleb Stirewalt & Henry Pless & proved by the latter in May 1847. (This is lot #3 in the estate of deceased John Stirewalt, Jr.)

Book 34 page 59: Dec. 17 1836, Caleb Stirewalt -- no wife signs -- lets Henry Pless (both of Rowan Co., N.C.) have 68½ acres on Dutch Buffelow Creek next John Roseman, John Stirewalt & lot #2 in the division of deceased John Stirewalt Jr., for \$400.00, witnessed by John F. Stirewalt & Jacob Shaver & proved by the latter in Feb. 1839.

Henry Pless (Dutch Buffalo Creek)

Book 20 page 455: Aug-24 1814, Joseph Hays of Rowan Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Henry Pless of Cabarrus Co.N.C., have 180 acres on Dutch Buffeloe Creek next William Miller, Jacob Postian, William Hays on the west bank of said creek next Michael Shuping, for \$600.00, witnessed by ? , J.Andrews & Richard Anderson " proved by the last named in May 1815.

Book 20 page 451: Jan. 28 1815, William Hays--no wife signs--lets David Masters (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 275 acres on the head branches of Dutch Buffalo Creek & two branches of Crain Creek next Richard Anderson (lately Isaac McNeely's), John Gardner (had been Richard Trotter's & formerly John Campbell's), Henry Pless (formerly Joseph Hay's) on the dividing line of Joseph Hays & the present tract, on the spring branch & crossing it, for \$500.00, witnessed by Matt Brandon & Nathaniel Johnston & proved by the latter in May 1815. (This is part of the land which Joseph Hays Sr. owned in fee simple & he divided with the said William Hays).

Book 16 page 302: Aug-15 1797, James Morrow of Mecklenburg Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Joseph Pless of Cabarrus Co.N.C., have 199 acres on Turkey Run (a branch of Cold Water Creek) next Nicholas Bevins, Charles Wood, Andrew Bostain, Joseph McPherson & Nicholas Beaver, for 75 pounds, witnessed by Robert Linn & Tetrick Leaman & proved by the latter in May 1798.

Henry Pless (Dutch Buffeloo Creek)

Book 41 page 390; Dec.18 1857, Mary Shaver out of love for her son, Paul J.Shaver--bot of Rowan Co.N.C.--gives him 125 acres on the line between Rowan & Cabarrus Counties on Dutch Buffaloe Creek next Jacob Pless, Michael Stirewalt & Reuben Shive

Book 32 page 250; Aug.8 1834, Henry Pless Sr. of Cabarrus Co.N.C.--no wife signs--lets Mary Shaver of Rowan Co.N.C., have 125 acres on both sides the Cabarrus County line on Dutch Second Creek by a branch & up said creek, for \$500.00, witnessed by Tobias Stirewalt & A.Roseman & proved by the latter in Nov. 1834.

Book 37 page 272; Jan.24 1845, Henry Pless--no wife signs--lets John Long trustee"for the benefit of The Chrystal spring school house society" have 2 acres near the headwaters of Dutch Buffeloo Creek "including The Chrystal spring grave yard" with privilege of a road, for \$7.00, witnessed by Caleb Stirewalt & P.A.Seaford & proved by the latter in Feb. 1845.

Book 33 page 428; Sept. 4 1837, John Eadleman & wife Elizabeth of Cabarrus Co.N.C., bind themselves on \$2000.00 bond, to let Samuel Deal of Rowan Co.N.C. have the land willed to the said Elizabeth by Henry Pleass, unless they repay the money, witness & proved by A.Rosamon in Feb. 1838.

Buried at Organ Church; Henry Pless born June 7 1765 died Nov. 25 1834 aged 69 yrs. 5 mos. & 8 days; Catherine Pless born June 13 1773 died Jan. 4 1838 aged 64 yrs. 6 mos & 24 days;

Seaford & Jacob Yost, for \$140.00, witnessed by A. Roseman acknowledged

on the same day.
