Book 2 page 24: April 15 1755, Esq. James Carter & Hugh Forster (trustees of the town of Salisbury, N.C.) let Joseph Woods of Rowan Co.N.C., have lot #1 in the west square of the town (144 perches)

Book 13 page 583: March 28 1792; Esq. Valentine Beard--no wife signs--lets Vinson Wood (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 190 acres for _____ witnessed by Charles Dunn & George Dunn & proved in May 1794. (The State granted this to said Beard).

Book 13 page 582: April 31 1794, Vinson Wood--no wife signs--lets Emos Reed, a minor (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have 190 acres, for 200 pounds, witnessed by Richard Leach & acknowledged in May 1794. (This is part of a State Grant to Esq. Valentine Beard who let said Wood have this on March 28 1792).

Daniel Wood gets for 22 pounds 420⁷ acres of land on south side of
 Yadkin River and Sandy Creek next Joseph Goss, William Wood, & Hull's
 Mill Pond from Margeret Goss on Aug. 12 1784. (Book B page 125). She
 sells 100 acres to John Miller on Nov. 8 1785 and it seems to be part
 of a tract of 420 acres which was granted by the State on Oct. 10 1783.
 (Book 10 page 355). She lets Miller have his for 20 pounds.

John Garrott, son of Daniel Garrott deceased, chooses his step-father
 Joseph Goss for guardian in 1766 In 1764, Joseph Goss is appointed
 guardians for the orphans of the deceased Daniel Garrett: (Daniel, Michael,
 & Elizabeth Garrett) with Wm. Giles & Wm. Lynn as securities, and a
 little later Eve Garrett is added to his charge. It is up to me to find
 out more of the widow of Daniel Garrett who married Joseph Goss and
 Daniel's will or division of estate.

 the graveyard, John Irwin, James Kerr, James Graham, --- Moore, bank of a branch, for \$800.00,
 witnessed by Samuel Graham & William B. Graham & proved in Nov. 1811. (This is part of the
 tract granted to James Hemphill & conveyed to James Colhoun? who let --- Moore have & he
 let said Robert Irwin have).

May 1801: Deed from James Calhoun? to John Moore for 509 acres Aug. 24 1799 proved by James
 Young.

Book 17 page 617: Aug. 24 1799, James Calhoun of South Carolina--no wife signs--lets John
 Moore or Moon? of N.C., have 509 acres on south side of Fourth Creek next said Moore or
 Moon(?) spring next Frederick Gross, George Hillyard, James Kerr, John Erwin, the graveyard,
 Alexander McNeely & a mill-dam, for 500 pounds, witnessed by James Young & Joseph Young &
 proved by the latter in May 1801. (This is part of a grant to James Hemphill)

 by John Moore.

Book 17 page 674: Feb. 6 1801. James Calhoun of South Carolina--no wife signs--lets Frederick
 Gross of North Carolina, have 162¹/₂ acres on south side of Fourth Creek next George Millar,
 for 80 pounds, witnessed by Joseph Young & John Moore & proved by the latter in Aug. 1801.
 (This is part of the tract of James Hemphill).

May 1801: Deed from the Exrs. of John Hemphill to James Calhoun for 797 acres Dec. 15 1797
 proved by Samuel Young.

Book 17 pages 647-8; Dec. 15 1797, the legal heirs of deceased James Hemphill deceased of
 Rowan Co. N.C. (who are Susannah, Andrew & Samuel Hemphill of Albert Co. Ga.) let James Calhoun
 of Rowan Co. N.C., have their land which was originally 797 acres on both sides of Fourth
 Creek next John Morrison on the west, --- Kerr on the south, Henry Hughey on the north & ---
 Armstrong on the east, for --- witnessed by Samuel Young, William Daniel & proved by
 James Young in May 1801.

Adams have 225 acres on Fourth Creek beginning next John Johnson, by the graveyard wall, John Irvin, James Kerr, between said Wood & Kerr next Zadock Griffith, on bank of branch to the first fork, for \$1000.00, witnessed by Daniel Lyle & Rufus H. Kilpatrick & proved by the latter in Nov. 1837.

Book 34 page 254: Nov. 2 1839, Rev'd. James M.H. Adams of Rowan Co. N.C.--no wife signs--lets John Irvin of have 225 acres on Fourth Creek next what was John Johnson's, the graveyard wall, John Irvin, James Kerr, between said Adams & said Kerr, also between said Adams & Zadock Griffith on the road, for \$2125.00, witnessed by W.B. Wood & Ninian Cowan & proved by the latter in Nov. 1829.

Book 18 page 307: On Feb. 20 1802, Isaac Anderson no wife signs--lets Daniel Wood--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 160 acres between Fourth Creek & the South Yadkin River next John Luckey & John Lowry, for 100 pounds, witnessed by Samuel & Isaac Anderson & proved by the latter in May 1802. (This had been granted by The State to Andrew Shields in 1780, he let Joseph Shields have it, he let William Brazil have it & he let Daniel Wood () have it--). The will of Andrew Shields (Book D page 47) made while 'sick and weak' on March 23 1790. Son Joseph (land where I now live). Daughters: Anna, Isabella & Margaret. Good friend & brother Dr. John Hall. Exrs: friend John Halland Samuel Young. Witnesses: Isaac Anderson, William Brown & Sarah Hall.

Book 23 page 39: On July 11 1812, William F. Anderson--no wife signs--lets Daniel Wood (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 40 acres on a branch next said Daniel Wood, Samuel Anderson, a lane & John Johnston, for 100 pounds, witnessed by John Wood, James Collins & Samuel Anderson & proved by the last named in Feb. 1814.

Book 35 page 131: Sept. 13 1840, Robert N. Fleming (as the executor of deceased William F. Anderson) lets Margaret Anderson--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have where the said Margaret now lives being 127 acres where the said deceased lived next John Watson, James Watson on the north bank of Fourth Creek next Rufus D. Johnston, the spring branch of Isaac Anderson & down it to the said creek next Robert N. Fleming & Jesse Johnston, for \$300.00, witnessed by J. Krider & Rufus H. Kilpatrick & proved by the latter in Feb. 1841.

Book 41 page 557: Dec. 28 1859, Esq. Luke Blackmer (as C.M.E., on a petition for sale by the heirs of deceased Margaret Anderson & was sold July 30 1857) lets John D. Johnston have 110 acres on the north bank of Fourth Creek next James Watson, J.D. Johnston, R.D. Johnston, G.A. Locke, the spring-branch of Isaac Anderson & A.A. Hart, for \$386.60, acknowledged in Feb.?

Book 21 page 28: Nov. 15 1806, George Williams of Rowan Co.N.C. (as the attorney in fact of Henry Williams dated Oct. 30 1806) lets Daniel Wood of same place, have 180 acres on north bank of Fourth Creek, for witnessed by James Crooke & William Moore & proved by the latter in Aug. 1807. (John Lowry let said Henry Williams have this).

Book 27 page 741 or 787 (numbered twice): March 12 1824, Samuel Van Etten--no wife signs--lets John Van Etten (both of Rowan Co.N.C.) have _____ acres on north side of Fourth Creek on its bank next the whole tract of William Hall, William Anderson, & the spring branch of Daniel Wood, for \$800.00, witnessed by F. Neely & John Andrews & proved by latter in May 1824. (over)

Book 125 page 67; Dec. 15 1910, Mary G. Knox, widow of Rowan Co.N.C., lets Lillie B. Fleming of same place, W. Brodie Wood of Iredell Co.N.C., J. Charles Wood of Big Sandy, Texas, Mary C. Green of Clear Water S.C., James S. Wood of Big Sandy Texas, Margaret N. Andrews of Iredell Co.N.C., D. Burton Wood of Rowan Co.N.C. & Lee C. Wood of Corinth, Miss., have 21 acres 1 rod & 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ perches on north bank of Third Creek, for \$85.00, acknowledged on Dec. 28 1910.

Samuel Wood (South side of Grants Creek)

Aug. 1778, Lease & release from Samuel Woods & wife to Jacob Frieze for 387 acres dated Nov. 29 1778 proved by Jas. McCulloh.

Book 8 page 522; July 30 1778, Samuel Woods & wife Sarah let Jacob Frieze--all of Rowan Co., N.C.,--have 387 acres on the south side of Grants Creek, beginning at a hickory & going north 64 chains & 50 links to a white oak, east 60 chains to the corner of Matthew Gillespie, south 64 chains & 50 links with the line of said Gillespie to his corner white oak, then west to the beginning, for 300 pounds proclamation money, witnessed by Mickel Albright & James McCulloh & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1778.

Book 1 page 113; March 19 1754, Matthew Gallaspy, a cordwiner, (Anna Gallaspie makes her mark), lets the planter, Samuel Wood--both of Rowan Co. N.C.--have 387 acres beginning on the south side of Grants Creek at a hickory, going north 64 chains & 50 links to a white oak, east 60 chains to a stake on the corner of Matthew Gallaspey, south 64 chains & 50 links with said Gallaspey's line to a white oak on his corner, then west to the beginning, for 5 shillings (on March 18th while the release price on the 19th is 100 pounds), witnessed by John Dunn & John Brandon & recorded. (The lease says Samuel Wood is of Anson Co. N.C.).
March 19 1754; "Lease and Release from Matthew Gaspie and Ann Gaspie to Saml Wood Proved" by Esq. John Brandon.

Ison Wood (Waters of Dycas Creek).

Book 14 page 322, May 3, 1802, Ison Wood--no wife signed--let Bryant Twinn, (both are yeomen of Rowan Co., N.C.), have 50 acres on the waters of Dycas Creek, beginning at a small post oak on the corner of William Wood & the line of John Dancy, & going with his line north 19 chains & 50 links to a small black oak on the corner of the original survey, west with the old line 25 chains to a post oak on the old line, south 19 chains & 50 links to the line of William Wood, then east with his line 26 chains to the beginning, for 25 pounds, witnessed by Henry Roberts & John Harwood & proved by the latter in Aug. court of 1806. (This is part of the State Grant of 350 acres sold to Henry Roberts Dec. 20, 1791.)

Book 14 page 546 or 546, (numbered twice); July 13, 1796, Henry Roberts, a blacksmith,--no wife signed--let the yeoman, Ison Wood, (both of Rowan Co., N.C.), have 50 acres on the waters of Dycas Creek, beginning on the corner of William Wood & the line of John Dancy at a small post oak & going with the said line north 19 chains & 50 links to a small black oak on the corner of the original survey, west with the old line of the original survey 26 chains to a post oak on the old line, south 19 chains & 50 links to a stake on the line of William Wood, then east with his line 26 chains to the beginning corner, for 25 pounds specie, witnessed by Jacob Gobble & John Gobble but proved by William Gobble in Nov. court of 1796. (This is part of the 350 acres sold by The State to the said Henry Roberts Dec. 1791).

Book 13 page 90; Dec. 20, 1791, The State granted, (\$2156 at 10 pounds the 100 acres), to Henry Roberts 350 acres on the waters of Dycas Creek, beginning on the line of John Beeth at a stake & going with it south 4 chains to a white oak, east 30 chains to a black oak on the corner of Jaret Wood, west with it 20 chains to a post oak on his corner, south 63 chains to a stake, west 11 chains & 50 links to a stake, north 57 chains & 50 links to a stake on the corner of Jacob Gobble, west 16 chains to a stake, north 17 chains to a stake, then east to the beginning.

Book 23 page 585: Aug. 13 1815, Thomas, Isham & James Wood of Smith Co. Tenn. appoint John Wood of same place their attorney to get what is due them acknowledged in Aug. 1815, certified by William Meere chairman of said county & Robert Allen as clerk.

Book 23 page 586: Oct. 12 1815, William Wood of Smith Co. Tenn. appoints John Wood of same to get what belongs to him, as above.

Book 25 page 402: Aug. 22 1816, Samuel Anderson--no wife signs--lets Samuel Vaneter(?) both of Rowan Co. N.C., have 144 acres on north side of Fourth Creek on its bank next John Hall, Isaac Anderson Sr.'s spring-branch, & Daniel Wood, going on up the creek, for \$800.00, witnessed by Jeremiah Robinson & William T. Anderson & proved by the latter in Aug. 1819. (This is part of a tract granted to Robert Tate on Jan. 29 1755 & conveyed to John Luckie, & then conveyed to Isaac Anderson Sr.)

Book 3 page 417: April 20 1756, William Eslavin & wife Isabel (whose mark indicates she was a Luckie) let John Luckey Jr. (both men planters, have 300 acres on north side Fourth Creek waters of South Yadkin for 5 shillings--release price being 32 pounds next day--(had been originally indentured to Robt. Tate Jan. 29 1755 & he released it to said Eslaven) witnessed by Andrew Allison & Robert Luckie & acknowledged on Oct. 19 1756. Oct. 24 1755: Lease & release from Robt. Tate to Wm. Sleven for 300 acres is acknowledged.

Book 18 page 239: On April 16 1801, Richard Luckey--no wife signs--lets Isaac Anderson (both of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 196 acres on the south side of Beaver Dam Branch, for 185 pounds, 12 shillings & 6 pence, witnessed by John Johnston & Thomas Anderson & proved by the latter in May 1802.

Book 15 page 145: Aug. 1 1797, Isaac Anderson & wife Sarah let Thomas Anderson (both planters of Rowan) have 196 acres on Beaverdam branch waters of South Yadkin, for 5 shillings, witnessed by Mary Farmer & Anne Anderson & proved by latter in Aug. 1797. (Originally granted to Samuel, John & Joseph Luckey Dec. 21 1761 & sold by John Luckey to said Isaac Anderson).

Book 18 page 304: On Feb. 20 1802, Thomas & Isaac Anderson Jr. (Exrs. of the deceased Richard Anderson of Rowan Co. N.C.) let Daniel Wood have 120 acres between Fourth Creek & the South Yadkin River next John Culbertson, deceased Anderson & ---Johnston, for 81 pounds, witnessed by Samuel & Isaac Anderson & proved by the latter in May 1802. (This is part of a tract of land granted John Luckey in 1780--see book 9 page 234--who let Isaac Anderson Sr. have it).

West let her have--see book 51 page 299); also 60? acres (which Joseph & Margaret Henderson with trustee John M. Coffin let her have on Nov. 5 1866--see book 43 page 360) of which 20 acres has been sold to Dr. J.J. Sumerell, for \$300.00

Hampton Bible owned by Miss Edith McKenzie: Joe Henderson & Margaret L. Wood were married Dec. 30 1856 by Rev. R. G. Barnet. Mrs. Clementine (Krider) Brown says her cousin, Margaret Wood married 1st Joe Henderson (a descendant of the Mangleburg family) by whom she had two children (Jenny who married Hartness & Sally who married Miller) she then married John Cornelius Lytaker who fled after killing Robert Harris (father of Lon Harris of China Grove).
