(This is part of a tract granted Moses White on Dec. 21 1761).

N.C.) have 103 acres on Potts Creek next --- Willis, --- Wiseman & Andrew Merrell, for 50 pounds, witnessed by Elijah Merrell & Andrew Merrell & proved by the latter in Nov. 1791. (This is part of the land which Thomas White let said Elliott have).

Book 11 page 788: July 11 1788, The State grants (#1889 at 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Andrew Merrell 350 acres on the north side of the Yadkin River where Lewis McCartney formerly owned next Nathaniel Parker, John Moore, Thomas Willis & Thomas White.

The will of Thomas White (book D page 270) made while very sick & weak on Jan. 14 1801. He is the son of deceased Joseph White of Annal Co. Maryland who left him land there which probably should be sold and proceeds given to my wife to buy here. Wife Sarah (all land). Children: Amalia, Joseph, Charly?, William, Thomas, Asa, Mary & Benne?. Exrs: son Joseph & Josiah Cen. Witnesses: John Smith, Harrod B. Pruitt, Samuel Walk & Obadiah Smith.

May 4 1801: The will of Thomas White is proven by John Smith & Herod B. Pruitt; letters are issued to Joseph White & Josiah Owins.

Aug. 4 1806: Joseph White (One of the creators of Thomas White) relinquished. Josiah Owen is appointed guardian of Binni (orphan of Thomas White) & gave bond of 400 pounds; John Nicholson appointed guardian of Asa (orphan of Thomas White) gave bond of 400 pound

Book 19 page 537: May 14 1803, Jonathan Merrell---no wife signs---lets Solomon Coats (bot of Rowan Co. N.C.) have 100 acres on Potts Creek next Maxwell Chambers, William Wiseman, Drewry Peoples, --- Collins & John Adams, for \$150.00, witnessed by Vincent Tabb & Wm. Adams & acknowledged in Feb. 1806. (This is part of 389 acres granted to John? White, who let William Elliott have who let said Merrell have).

Book 11 page 731: Feb. 3 1786, Thomas White (a mechanic?---no wife signs) let John Brevard Jr.---both of Rowan Co. 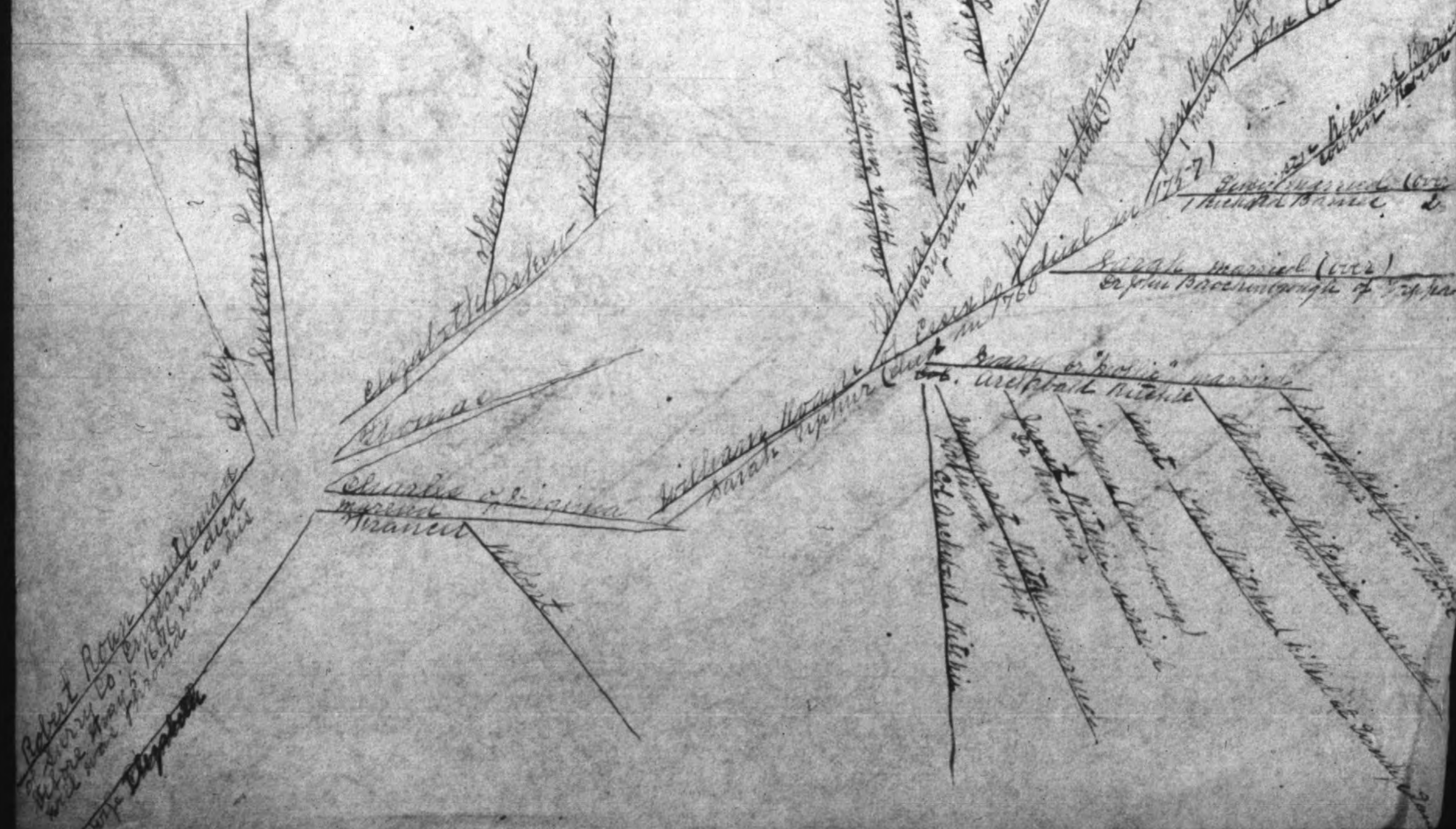
