Shadrack Alley of Virginia + North Carolina.

G.A.R. Lineage, Vol 84, page 33: Mrs Chas. Brightwell, (Cora Sambert), born at Clarksville, Georgia, joined as # 89092, from the service of Shadrack Alley (1751-1895), born in Brunswick Co., Virginia, died in Iredell Co., North Carolina, who received a Pension for service as a Private in Capt. Vaughan's Co. of Col. Elliott's Virginia Regiment in 1776 + in as a Private in Capt. Whiteside's Co. of The North Carolina Line in 1780.

"Catawba Frontier 1775-1781 Memories of Pensioners" (published in 1950 at 2399, Nebraska Ave., Washington, D.C., by the compiler, Mary Elmer Sawyer), page 11: "ALLEY, SHADRICK 1780. Having served four tours in Virginia, he removed his family to Tryon, later Rutherford County, North Carolina, and from there was sent on his fifth tour to the Alpine Creek, Mecklenburg County, where he lay for some time. Then on to Salisbury, where he was discharged. In the fall of 1780 he served under Captain Whitesides for protection of frontier against Cherokees.

"1781. Served three months and was at Battle of Guilford Court House. On to Petersburg, where he was drafted for three months. Was at the surrender of Cornwallis.

"Born in Virginia in 1751, and was living in Brunswick County, near the North Carolina line, when the Revolution began. After the Battle of Guilford Court House he returned to Brunswick County, but later moved back to North Carolina. Witnesses to his service were William Knox and Adam Torrence."

"Among the Pensioners of the Revolutionary War in Iredell Co., N.C., was Shadrack Allen, age 83 years, who received \$240.00 as a Private in the North Carolina Militia, beginning March 4, 1831.
